- Was a teacher for 17 years, principal for 20 years, professor at Southern CT, UCONN
- Presently managing director for Fund for Teachers, funds for professional development
- Goal 1: Chester Board of Education welcomes parents to join their meetings. Bring your kids if you want. They want to hear parent opinions when making decisions.
- Goal 2: There are currently 9 members of the Chester Board of Education. Up to 6 of them are
 potentially going to end their tenure (end of their 4 year cycle) and will be looking for people to join the
 board. Would like more parents to be on the BOE
 - Qualifications: resident and voting member of the town of Chester.
 - Responsibilities: OVERALL, represent parents and their needs
 - working with superintendent to hear his initiations, needs, celebrations and to support them
 - Assist with developing education policy
 - Develop short and long range goals for district
 - Ensure that we have a highly qualified superintendent
 - Key issue: Potential consolidation of elementary schools
 - Student population will decrease based on future projections
 - CES has 191 students already a small school
 - pros community
 - cons limited exposure to different people, reduced economic efficiency
 - Unique budgeting among schools each school has their own budget so no flexibility in sharing resources among the 5 schools. Conversations about changing this.
 - Want parent input as these conversations develop.
- Typically meet Thursday at CES 7-8:30pm. Meetings are recorded and available online. Sept, Nov, Dec, Jan & February busy to prep budget.
- If on CBoE then you are also on the supervisory board medical, busing so will have a few additional meetings to attend.
- The next meeting is this Thursday 6pm and is a second workshop of the school budget. Superintendent
 White presented presumed requests and needs at the first budget workshop. Second meeting refines
 the allocations.
- Next regular Board of Education meeting March 27th at 6pm at CES library.
