

At the Beaverton Resource Center, our senior program continues to grow—currently supporting 39 older adults in our community. Many are navigating complex challenges, from housing insecurity to social isolation, and we're honored to walk alongside them with care and compassion.

Just recently, one of our senior clients—who lives in Washington County-supported housing—was at risk of losing her home. She didn't have a computer and couldn't access the recertification paperwork online. But thanks to a thoughtful phone call with Laura from our team, we were able to complete the application together, step by step, over the phone. Afterward, she told us, "I was just having this issue and didn't know what to do. Laura, you're my angel."

Every once in a while, someone quietly reminds us what it means to live with heart. A few weeks ago, we had the honor of welcoming a familiar face through the doors of the Beaverton Resource Center, our longtime friend, Jake.

Jake is a retired senior, a former volunteer Care to Share Food Pantry manager, and someone who has spent countless hours giving back to his neighbors.
