For the last 5 years, the BRC Family Resource Fair has been a beloved tradition, bringing families, service providers, community partners and volunteers together for a day of connection and support. This year, we've made the difficult decision to shift to a virtual celebration out of care and concern for our Spanish-speaking and undocumented community members.

With ongoing fears around immigration enforcement, many families have told us they would not feel safe attending an inperson event. We are committed to honoring those concerns by creating a safe, trauma-informed alternative that still delivers meaningful impact.

### This year's virtual celebration will include:

- Digital spotlights of partner agencies via social media and on our website
- Inspiring videos that highlight available resources and community success stories
- Direct delivery of school supplies, partner swag bags and resource kits to local schools



Since opening our doors during the pandemic, the Beaverton Resource Center has become a vibrant hub of support, connection, and care for thousands of families navigating poverty in Washington County. Thanks to your partnership and the trust of the community, we've reached a point where our current space—while beloved—is no longer able to support the scope of our work. We are now actively seeking a new, larger facility that reflects our vision for the future: a one-stop center that is welcoming, accessible, and equipped to meet the evolving needs of the community.

- 10–14 private offices for our dedicated on-site partners and staff
- A large community space for workshops, events, and training opportunities
- ADA-accessible restrooms
- A commercial kitchen
- A dedicated Care to Share Call Center space (with 8 desks and sound-friendly infrastructure)
- A welcoming reception area
- A children's area for childcare and child related activities



### A Letter from the Desk of the BRC Co-Founders

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

The past few months have brought unexpected challenges to the Beaverton Resource Center—challenges that have tested our capacity, our creativity, and our commitment to serving this community we love so deeply.

As many of you know, we have been incredibly fortunate to partner with <u>Easterseals Oregon</u> over the past four years through the <u>Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP)</u>. This partnership has been a cornerstone of our success, providing low-income seniors with meaningful job training, employment support, and social connection, while also staffing our <u>Care to Share Call Center</u>, scheduling <u>Mobile Health Van visits</u>, and coordinating appointments at our eight food pantries across Washington County. Sadly, due to a federal funding freeze, this vital partnership has come to a sudden and unexpected halt.

The ripple effect of the federal funding freeze has been significant. Half of our Health & Wellness grant-funded programming has been impacted as well. We've had to say goodbye to our beloved Marketing and Social Media Coordinator, Volunteer Coordinator, and Event Coordinator, all positions that have played crucial roles in connecting our community to the resources it needs. And yet, in the face of these hardships, the spirit of the Beaverton Resource Center remains strong. Several of the individuals whose paid roles were cut have made the extraordinary decision to stay on as volunteers, offering their time, their heart, and their talent for as long as they are able. Each one has said, "This is the best job I've ever had." Their dedication is a powerful reminder of the mission we share, and the kind of organization we've built together.

We are resilient. We are faithful. And we are not giving up.

But we cannot do it alone.

We are reaching out to ask for your support, now more than ever.
