VANC was created in 2003 by Jill Banks Barad as a coalition to represent the thirty-four Neighborhood Councils (NCs) located in the San Fernando Valley. Jill was President of the Sherman Oaks NC.

Some of the notable VANC accomplishments have been:

- **Advocacy for Neighborhood Council Representation:** Successfully secured a five-minute speaking opportunity for Neighborhood Council representatives during City Council and committee meetings, ensuring that local voices are heard in citywide decision-making processes.
- **Animal Welfare Initiatives:** Passed numerous resolutions related to animal welfare, contributing to the protection and saving of countless dogs and cats. VANC has also addressed critical issues such as the conditions in city animal shelters and the rights of volunteers, advocating for humane treatment and transparency.
- **Support for Neighborhood Council Operations:** Advocated for increased funding and operational resources for Neighborhood Councils, strengthening their capacity to serve their communities effectively.
- **Facilitation of Networking and Knowledge Sharing:** Provide a platform for Neighborhood Councils to connect, recognizing that many face similar challenges. Through VANC, councils can share diverse solutions and perspectives, expanding their knowledge and fostering collaborative problem-solving.
- **Best of Awards Event:** Hosts the *annual* "Best of" Awards event, celebrating Neighborhood Councils that have made significant impacts in their communities. This event highlights innovative projects and encourages the sharing of best practices.
- **Planning & Land Use Workshops:** Organized workshops featuring key professionals and representatives from city, state, county, and federal levels, providing Neighborhood Councils with valuable insights into planning and land use issues.

OBJECTIVES

- Identify problems and help develop solutions to issues of concern to Neighborhood Councils in the Valley and throughout the City.
- Promote Neighborhood Council informed participation in the political process regarding local, regional, and City issues,
- Advocate before City Council, Council Committees, Department of Neighborhood Empowerment, and Board of Neighborhood Commissioners as one voice on issues that affect the City and Neighborhood Councils.

GOALS

- Offer a forum for dialogue with elected officials and department heads.
- Make Neighborhood Councils more effective at each level of organization.
- Act as a clearinghouse and resource center on Neighborhood Council and City of Los Angeles issues.
- Encourage involvement of stakeholders in the Neighborhood Council process through effective outreach
- Conduct ongoing research, discussion, and education.
