Be ready with team member at gate. Foreman will give you a rope (if you didn't bring your own) and saddlebags. Be familiar with contents of saddlebags. You may have your own "horse holders" follow you through course -or- you may hold your reins while on ground if your horse doesn't ground tie. Unless specified, team determines gait and path between obstacles. This is NOT a timed event, but efficiency matters. If youth is on team, adult must drag.

- 1. Once team before you proceeds to hay loading obstacle #7, work gate to enter ensure gate is closed.
- 2. Both team members exhibit pasture covering trot and each jumps different log.
- 3. Continue ground covering trot (trot judged separately from jumps).
- 4. One team member drags calf to "branding fire", the other dismounts to brand/vaccinate the calf. Return the calf/rope to original position.
- 5. Rider starts at cone, ride to feedbunk, drag feedbunk to feed sacks, partner loads sacks, drag to other cone, partner unloads, return feed bunk.
- 6. Ride to electric fence, repair fence, pound post three times.
- 7. Load 2 bales of hay into bed of gator.
- 8. Rider ropes dummy. Once caught, other team member gives a dose of "antibiotics", recoil rope.
- 9. Work two gates into cattle pens, ensure gates are closed.
- 10. Both partners walk through cattle pen counting cattle, record number of cattle in notebook. Announce # counted to judge.
- 11. Work gate, ensure gate is closed.
- 12. Load one horse into trailer. Both partners wave to judge to signal completion.
