## **PRESENTATION**

*(The president of the congregation presents the candidates.)*

Dear friends, we give thanks for the gift of baptism and for these young people who are making public affirmation of their baptism.

I present Dawson Beito, Hayden Comstock, Jett Cornelius, McKenzie Hintz, Parker Milender, Casey Nelson, Ike Olson, and Braylee Wiene who desire to make public affirmation of their baptism.

*(The presiding minister continues when confirmands face the altar.)*

Let us pray.

Merciful God, we thank you for these sisters and brothers, whom you have made your own by water and the Word in baptism.

You have called them to yourself, enlightened them with the gifts of your Spirit, and nourished them in the community of faith.

Uphold your servants in the gifts and promises of baptism, and unite the hearts of all whom you have brought to new birth.

We ask this in the name of Christ.

**Amen.**

## **\*PROFESSION OF FAITH**

*(The presiding minister addresses those making public affirmation of baptism. The assembly rises to join in the responses.)*

I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God, the powers of this world that rebel against God, and the ways of sin that draw you from God?

*Response:* I renounce them.



Together we proclaim our faith using the words of the Apostles' Creed...let us say what we believe:

**I believe in God, the Father almighty,  
creator of heaven and earth.**

**I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,  
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,  
born of the virgin Mary,  
suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried;  
he descended to the dead.  
On the third day he rose again;  
he ascended into heaven,  
he is seated at the right hand of the Father,  
and he will come to judge the living and the dead.**

**I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic church,

*(The presiding minister addresses those making public affirmation of baptism as they face the minister..)*

to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,  
to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,  
to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,  
and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

*Each candidate responds:* I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give us new birth, cleanse us from sin, and raise us to eternal life.

*(Each individual kneels for the laying on of hands and the blessing as family members stand behind them.)*

Stir up in Dawson, Hayden, Jett, McKenzie, Parker, Casey, Ike, and Braylee the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

*(The "Alleluia" is sung after each blessing of the confirmand. Each individual and their family return to their places as the next comes to kneel.)*



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# Let Us Break Bread Together

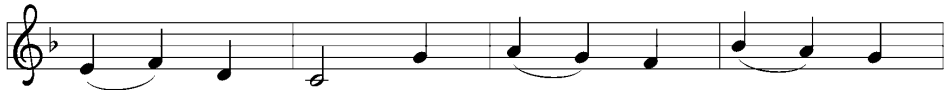
