



Information from the Finance and Faith & Family Stewardship Committees,

expenses for each month in 2022. Because we have not had a Pastor or youth director this past year, monthly expenses have been much less than can be November is the time of the year when budgets, expenses, and contribution trends are reviewed for the year. The graph illustrates budgeted income and expected when we have a full time Pastor on staff. Before the end of the year an additional payment of \$5,500 and \$500 to the Synod and Pathways (respectively) will be paid to complete Redeemer's yearly commitment. The 2022 budget was an unknown—created for a pastor in the middle of the salary guideline. Pastor White is coming with more experience. Giving will have throughout the year. One such expense was \$7, 530.00 paid for repairs on an Air conditioner/pump. Throughout the winter months heating expenses were to be stepped up by all to make sure we can afford to keep operating in the same capacity and help Pastor White grow our activities. Throughout the year committee, custodial, and office expenses have stayed within planned budgets. There have been only a few unusual or unexpected expenses noted high and some boiler work had to be completed.

On Sunday, October 23, we had the annual "Blessing of the Quilts" as part our our worship service. Redeemer Church is know for beautiful quilts that have been distributed locally and shipped all over the world. Our members have also bee avid participants in the Malaria project and worldwide farm. They gather school supplies for needy students, collect socks for needy feet of all sizes, and host a huge spaghetti dinner fundraiser for Hospice of the Red River Valley. These are just a few ways that Redeemer Church has reached out into the community and into the world. I would like to express appreciation on behalf of my mother, Annabelle, my sister—Pastor Terri Cuppett and myself for the many kind things that you have done to help our family. The latest kind gesture was joining forces with the St. Hilaire Lions to put on a benefit to raise money for my new prosthetic eyes. Members of Redeemer baked yummy goodies for the bake sale, gave monetary contributions and bought hearty pancake breakfasts at the benefit. The quilters organized a raffle, and one of our members, Juneal Peterson, won the quilt. The whole day was so special that it almost made me cry. To my knowledge, \$8500 was raised at the benefit More money may have cone in that I don't know about yet. I also received some individual contributions totaling \$1475. This exceeds the \$5400 price that I was quoted at the Midwest Eye Center in Fargo, ND. The price may actually be higher so I will have to see about that. Anyway, I have received an abundance of contributions that will cover the cost of my artificial eyes and travel expenses. The procedure has two steps that will occur over two days. I am scheduled to go to Fargo on Wednesday, November 2 and Thursday, November 3. Paula Adamson will be traveling with me to Fargo, and will be staying overnight in a hotel. In case you are wondering what the procedure is all about, I will give you my unglamorous, unscientific explanation. When I arrive on Wednesday, the technicians will put some "goop" into each eye socket to form a mold. The process isn't painful, bit it is extremely cold. BRRR! The next day, I come back and receive my prosthetic eyes. They are sturdy, plastic shells that will fit securely into my eye sockets. They will protect my sockets from pain and infection. The technicians are very careful to make the shells look like real eyes. I have requested brown eyes, so that is what I will receive. If some of you were thinking that these expensive prosthetics would cause me to see, that won't be happening. Medical technology hasn't advanced that far yet.

I want all of you to know that I have had an amazing life and the older I get, the more fun I have. I am glad that I can serve as your cantor and on various committees. My whole family will continue to pay it forward as we encounter needs within our church and beyond. Thank you all for your help. Soon I will be able to show you my big brown eyes, the result of your generosity. God's peace and blessings to everyone! In closing, I would like to share a verse from one of my favorite hymns: "God, Whose Giving Knows No Ending".

The Potter's Hands

Scripture Reading: Jeremiah 18:1-11

Surrender to what is. Let go of what was. Have faith in what will be. —Sonia Ricotti

In 1902, Adelaide A. Pollard, a hymn writer, was hoping to go to Africa as a missionary but found herself unable to raise the needed funds to make the journey.

Greatly discouraged, she attended a prayer service one evening, and, as she sat there, she overheard an elderly woman say, "It really doesn't matter what you do with us, Lord, just have your own way with our lives."

The elderly woman inspired Pollard, and she thought about the story of the potter from Jeremiah 18:1-11 (today's Old Testament reading). When she returned home that evening, she wrote all four stanzas of the well-known hymn, "Have Thine Own Way" before retiring for the night.

Have Thine own way, Lord! Have Thine own way! Thou art the Potter, I am the clay. Mold me and make me after Thy will; While I am waiting, yielded and still.

Have Thine own way, Lord! Have Thine own way! Hold o'er my being absolute sway! Fill with Thy Spirit 'till all shall see Christ only, always, living in me.

A potter needs a lot of strength to work with clay and get it centered properly. Clay often has a mind of its own, it seems. A potter must have strong fingers and arm strength.


