# Order of Worship Seventh Sunday after Pentecost Sunday, July 27, 2025

ACS = All Creation Sings (purple; the new hymnal supplement of the ELCA)





#### \*Prayer of the Day

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Let us pray...Almighty and ever-living God,

you are always more ready to hear than we are to pray, and you gladly give more than we either desire or deserve. Pour upon us your abundant mercy. Forgive us those things that weigh on our conscience, and give us those good things that come only through your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen.

## **WORD**

God speaks to us in scripture, preaching and song.

**First Reading:** Hosea's marriage to a faithless wife symbolizes Israel's faithlessness toward God. Even the names of Hosea's children—Jezreel (where Israel's idolatrous kings were killed), Lo-ruhamah ("not pitied"), and Lo-ammi ("not my people")—announce the nation's coming doom, countered by the proclamation that Israel remains a child of the living God.

#### Hosea 1:2-10

- <sup>2</sup>When the LORD first spoke through Hosea, the LORD said to Hosea, "Go, take for yourself a wife of whoredom and have children of whoredom, for the land commits great whoredom by forsaking the LORD." <sup>3</sup> So he went and took Gomer daughter of Diblaim, and she conceived and bore him a son.
- <sup>4</sup> And the LORD said to him, "Name him Jezreel; for in a little while I will punish the house of Jehu for the blood of Jezreel, and I will put an end to the kingdom of

the house of Israel. <sup>5</sup> On that day I will break the bow of Israel in the valley of Jezreel."

<sup>6</sup> She conceived again and bore a daughter. Then the LORD said to him, "Name her Lo-ruhamah, for I will no longer have pity on the house of Israel or forgive them. <sup>7</sup> But I will have pity on the house of Judah, and I will save them by the LORD their God; I will not save them by bow, or by sword, or by war, or by horses, or by horsemen."

<sup>8</sup> When she had weaned Lo-ruhamah, she conceived and bore a son. <sup>9</sup> Then the LORD said, "Name him Lo-ammi, for you are not my people and I am not your God."

<sup>10</sup> Yet the number of the people of Israel shall be like the sand of the sea, which can be neither measured nor numbered; and in the place where it was said to them, "You are not my people," it shall be said to them, "Children of the living God."

Word of God, word of life.

- <sup>1</sup> You have been gracious to your land, O LORD; you have restored the good fortune of Jacob.
- <sup>2</sup> You have forgiven the iniquity of your people and blotted out all their sins.

- <sup>4</sup> Restore us then, O God our Savior; let your anger depart from us.

- <sup>7</sup> Show us your steadfast love, O LORD, and grant us your salvation.

- <sup>9</sup> Truly, your salvation is very near to those who fear you, that your glory may dwell in our land.
- 10 Steadfast love and faithfulness have met together;

#### righteousness and peace have kissed each other.

- <sup>11</sup> Faithfulness shall spring up from the earth, and righteousness shall look down from heaven.
- 12 The LORD will indeed grant prosperity, and our land will yield its increase.
- <sup>13</sup> Righteousness shall go before the LORD and shall prepare for God a pathway.

\*Gospel: Luke 11:1-13

The holy gospel according to St. Luke...

Glory to you, O Lord.

<sup>1</sup> [Jesus] was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." He said to them, "When you pray, say:

Father, hallowed be your name.

Your kingdom come.

- <sup>3</sup> Give us each day our daily bread.
- <sup>4</sup> And forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us.

And do not bring us to the time of trial."

- <sup>5</sup> And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; <sup>6</sup> for a friend of mine has arrived, and I have nothing to set before him.' <sup>7</sup> And he answers from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot get up and give you anything.' <sup>8</sup> I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, at least because of his persistence he will get up and give him whatever he needs.
- <sup>9</sup> "So I say to you, Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. <sup>10</sup> For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. <sup>11</sup> Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for a fish, will give a snake instead of a fish? <sup>12</sup> Or if the child asks for an egg, will give a scorpion? <sup>13</sup> If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"
