Order of Worship Eighth Sunday after Pentecost Sunday, August 3, 2025

Today's texts offer instruction and encouragement for all who are occasionally overwhelmed by the "unhappy business" of life. Jesus urges us to take care and be on guard against all kinds of greed. We who have died with Christ in holy baptism have also been raised with him and are encouraged to elevate our thinking, seeking the "things that are above." To that end we seek the sustenance of the Lord's supper and the encouragement of God's word.

WORD

God speaks to us in scripture, preaching and song.

First Reading: Hosea compares God's love for Israel to the love parents have for their children. Whether teaching toddlers to walk or dealing with a child's rebellion, good parents continue to love their children as they try to lead them to life. In the same way, God's love will not let Israel go.

Hosea 11:1-11

- ¹ When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son.
- ² The more I called them, the more they went from me; they kept sacrificing to the Baals, and offering incense to idols.
- ³ Yet it was I who taught Ephraim to walk, I took them up in my arms; but they did not know that I healed them.
- ⁴ I led them with cords of human kindness, with bands of love.
- I was to them like those who lift infants to their cheeks.
 I bent down to them and fed them.
- ⁵ They shall return to the land of Egypt, and Assyria shall be their king, because they have refused to return to me.
- ⁶ The sword rages in their cities, it consumes their oracle-priests, and devours because of their schemes.

My people are bent on turning away from me. To the Most High they call, but he does not raise them up at all.

8 How can I give you up, Ephraim?
How can I hand you over, O Israel?
How can I make you like Admah?
How can I treat you like Zeboiim?
My heart recoils within me;
my compassion grows warm and tender.
9 I will not execute my fierce anger;
I will not again destroy Ephraim;
for I am God and no mortal,
the Holy One in your midst,
and I will not come in wrath.

10 They shall go after the LORD, who roars like a lion; when he roars,



*Gospel: Luke12:13-21

The holy gospel according to St. Luke...

Glory to you, O Lord.

¹³ Someone in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me." ¹⁴ But he said to him, "Friend, who set me to be a judge or arbitrator over you?" ¹⁵ And he said to them, "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." ¹⁶ Then he told them a parable: "The land of a rich man produced abundantly. ¹⁷ And he thought to himself, 'What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?' ¹⁸ Then he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. ¹⁹ And I will say to my soul, Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry.' ²⁰ But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' ²¹ So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God."





forever and ever. Amen




Distribution
