Admissions criteria	10-16yrs (Key stage 2-4) Students who are not engaging in School, at risk of exclusion, EOTAS, PEX and do not have a current School provision. We support neurodiverse students (ADHD/ASD) SEMH and those without a diagnosis. Referral forms can be located on our website
Programme overview	Our alternative provision offers a tailored and flexible education programme designed to support young people who are struggling to engage in mainstream education. We work with students at risk of exclusion, those experiencing poor mental health or those vulnerable to exploitation through county lines or other negative peer group involvement. Our core focus is to create a safe, nurturing environment that supports growth, emotional wellbeing as well as building on life skills. We deliver a blend of therapeutic, academic and enrichment support tailored to the individual needs of each student. Our aim is to build positive self-identity for students and equip them with the tools they need for long-term success. Our base is surrounded by a small wood and has access to a football pitch, tennis and badminton courts. We offer beauty taster sessions introducing practical treatments, mad Science, motorbike mechanics, GroWild using access to our local allotment.
Cost	£290 per day (9.30 to 2.30) for 1-1 support This includes breakfast, lunch, snacks, refreshments and any activities. There are no hidden costs.
Accredited courses	Students attending our setting make meaningful progress in a range of personal, social and practical area. These include but are not limited to building confidence, developing coping strategies, increasing resilience and improving self-esteem. We also support the growth of social interaction skills and help learners develop practical work-related abilities. Our tailored approach ensures that each student is supported in achieving outcomes that reflect their individual strengths and needs.
Programme length	1 term – full year and beyond
Delivery area(s)	The Dragonfly Programme is based at the St Faiths Centre Norwich NR10 3LF
Practicalities	Commissioners organise transport to and from our provision. Parents and students will be informed each week to appropriately dress for all activities. Hot meals and refreshments are provided. We do offer an outreach transport programme; this is at an additional cost and must be agreed through the admission process.
Safeguarding	All relevant staff have up to date DBS Certificates, DSL/Safeguarding training, PREVENT, Safer Recruitment, First Aid. All staff are registered with EduCare online for continued professional development.
