All the trails in the Bemidji area fall into these categories! Your ski pass fee helps us maintain Minnesota's cross-country ski trail system. In fact the Ski Club receives \$26,000 in volunteer earned grant-in-aid to maintain our local trails systems.

Passes can be purchased on-line or at local convenience stores that sell DNR licenses. The cost of a pass is:

Daily: \$6

One-season: \$20 Three-season: \$55

MOVIL MAZE - by Bill

A new shelter (officially called the Movil Maze Lodge) at the Movil Maze Recreational Area is becoming a reality and should be completed next spring, 2019. Spearheaded by the ski club, this shelter has been on the agenda for over four years when the Beltrami County Natural Resource Management department approached the ski club with a plan similar to the Three Island Park north shelter. The county was looking for financial support from potential users of a multi-use lodge to include both the ski club and the snowmobile club. The ski club strongly believed that the Movil Maze, being one of the true destination areas for not only Nordic skiing but snowmobiling, biking, hiking, and non-motorized hunting, was destined to have a more significant building to accommodate the rapidly increasing multi-use needs of the Movil Maze.

During this time frame, the ski club has worked side by side with user groups (skiers, snowmobilers and fat-tire bikers) and the county to come up with a very agreeable design to accommodate everyone at the table. The building will be larger than the Three Island building, have in-floor heating, electricity, outdoor changing area, a supply room, and an ample outdoor patio with picnic tables. It has been designed to be as maintenance free as possible; high pitched steel roof, steel siding with stone wainscoting, timber frame facade front patio, and great access to all of the trail systems (bikers, snowmobilers and skiers. This is phase one of three phases of a very ambitious project developed by the ski club and the county. Phase two is a newly designed parking lot, and phase three is lighting the first 1.2 KM loop as you enter the Movil Maze.



Partial funding was successfully acquired through a Federal Recreational Trails Grant that required \$50,000 in seed money: \$30,000 came from Beltrami County, \$5,000 from the Bemidji Area Cross Country Ski Club, \$5,000 from the North Country Snowmobile Club, and \$2,000 from the allowed in-kind work by the ski club's trail administrator in coordinating and developing the grant application. This left \$8,000.00 to be raised via donations by the ski club.

In early October, the ski club went to work to raise the required donations by starting a fundraising campaign through contacting many ski club members who have supported capital projects in the past. By early December, the ski club had exceeded the \$8000 goal so the project, after matching grant dollars were awarded, was fully funded at \$200,000! We want to give a special thanks to all those donors, especially the Bemidji Noon Rotary Club. Construction is ongoing and on schedule to be completed by late spring-early summer. It is located next to the parking lot and entry to the ski trail so stop by and take a look. Future annual meetings (first Sunday in May) will be held there as will various skiing events.

THANK YOU TO THE GEORGE W. NEILSON FOUNDATION

In May, the ski club applied for a grant from the George W. Neilson Foundation to purchase ATV's and a trailer for Sunday Ski School. The ski club received \$16,137 to purchase two ATVs and an enclosed trailer to transport skis, poles, boots and accessories for ski school and ski outings on the ski trails.

The club purchased two Honda ATV's from our local Bemidji Sports Centre and had them outfitted to meet the needs of the club, and purchased an enclosed trailer from our local Home Depot and had it wrapped in a ski club decal from the Ross Lewis Sign Co. Upgraded equipment makes the work of our volunteers more reliable, safe, and efficient.







Who teaches the lessons?

Lessons are taught by a group of volunteers from the Bemidji Area Cross Country Ski Club who have experience in teaching skiing. Lessons are designed to teach the "basic level skills" of both classical and skate skiing techniques.

Cost to participate in Ski School?
