

Twenty-Eighth Congress of the Republic of Texas

Proposed Resolution for an amendment to Article 1 Section 8 of the Constitution

Sec. 1. Be it resolved by the senate and the house of representatives of the republic of Texas in Congress assembled, under the Declaration of Emergency for the protection of the people of Texas, the following amendment be enacted within the election process due to threats imposed by an invasion of unlawful immigrants crossing the southern border of the republic of Texas, the presence of domestic terrorists operating within the republic of Texas government that interfered with the 2023 election that disenfranchised Texians of their right to vote in the 2023 election, the theft of the republic of Texas website and other media applications and a coup to overthrow the government of the republic of Texas.

Sec. 2. Be it further resolved to achieve protection for the Texian people who are domiciled on the lands of the republic of Texas **that** the following actions **be taken** under this Declaration of Emergency **of** amending the constitution of the republic of Texas **with the** objective of this amendment **being** to promote stability in the republic of Texas government by increasing the qualifications through requiring Congressional candidates to have been in the republic for at least three years.

Sec. 3. Be it further resolved, as is currently written in the constitution; Article 1 Section 8. The senators shall be chosen for the term of three years, on the first Monday in September; shall be citizens of the republic, reside in the district for which they are respectively chosen at least one year before the election, and shall have attained the age of thirty years.

Sec. 4. Be it further resolved the following amendment to the constitution, Article 1 Section 8, be enacted to read as follows:

The senators shall be chosen for the term of three years, on the first Monday in September and shall be Texian nationals of the republic **for “three” years and be native born of Texian parentage and shall be a national of the republic for “four” years for people immigrating from contiguous northern states, shall be a national of the republic for “nine” years for people immigrating from international countries and domiciled** in the district for which they are respectively chosen at least one year before the election and shall have attained the age of **thirty-five** years.
