Joint House Resolution 129-05-10-2024

Twenty-Eighth Congress of the republic of Texas

Proposed Resolution for an amendment to Article VI Section 1 of the Constitution

Sec. 1. Be it resolved by the senate and the house of representatives of the republic of Texas in Congress assembled, under the Declaration of Emergency for the protection of the people of Texas, the following amendment be enacted within the election process due to threats imposed by an invasion of unlawful immigrants crossing the borders of the republic of Texas, the presence of domestic terrorists operating within the republic of Texas government that interfered with the 2023 election that disenfranchised Texians of their right to vote in the 2023 election, the theft of the republic of Texas website and other media applications and a coup to overthrow the government of the republic of Texas.

Sec. 2. Be it further resolved, to achieve protection for the Texian people who are domiciled on the lands of the republic of Texas the following actions under this Declaration of Emergency are needed by amending the constitution of the republic of Texas. The objective of this amendment is to promote stability in the republic of Texas government by increasing the amount of time a presidential candidate has to be domiciled in the republic to be elected.

Sec. 3. Be it further resolved, as currently written in the Constitution: Article VI Section 1: No person shall be eligible to the office of president who shall not have attained the age of thirty-five years, shall be a citizen of the republic at the time of the adoption of this constitution, or an inhabitant of this republic at least three years immediately preceding his election. As Amended by Amendment Article VI, Sec. 1:

"Eligibility for the office of president of the republic of Texas includes having attained the age of thirty-five years, citizenship within the republic of Texas and domiciled within Texas for at least three years immediately preceding election to office." Voted by ballot and passed on September 5th, 2007 by the Texan people.

Sec. 4. Be it further resolved, the following amendment be enacted into the Constitution in Article VI Section 1 to read as follows:

No person shall be eligible to the office of president who shall not have attained the age of thirty-five years, shall be a citizen of the republic at the time of the adoption of this constitution, or an inhabitant of this republic at least three years immediately preceding his election.

Amended by Amendment Article VI, Sec. 1:

"Eligibility for the office of president of the republic of Texas includes having attained the age of thirty-five years, a Texian national within the republic of Texas and domiciled within Texas for at least seven years immediately preceding election to office."
