Greetings from the staff and Board of Directors of Kinship of Morrison County. I am pleased to provide you with this program & financial overview of 2023. Kinship has been serving youth in Morrison County through mentoring and group activities since 1974. We strive to live up to our Mission Statement; "to provide a one-to-one friendship in the most wholesome way possible with the intention that the child could show noticeable improvement in personal development." The youth we serve come from homes where they don't live with both parents and benefit from the influence of another positive adult in their life.

Kinship's youth development efforts focus on group mentoring activities and on 1:1 or family-based matches. In 2023 we hosted 13 activities including 2 fundraisers & 2 service projects, all of which brought our youth & adults together to share a variety of experiences side-by-side. Details on these activities are provided on pages 6 & 7.

Kinship's matches shared many everyday adventures beyond sponsored activities, several of which are highlighted through pictures in this report. The relationships formed during these times together is what Kinship is all about!

Financially, Kinship did well in 2023. The "Friends of Kinship" tables sponsors at the Cook-off continue to increase, making this year's the most successful yet! Kinship also received a number of large donations or grants (\$1000+) which were gratefully received. Kinship's Group Mentoring Activities

Kinship staff organizes monthly activities at no cost to our youth and volunteers. For un-matched participants, activities are an opportunity to experience new things side-by-side with other youth and volunteers. Matches are also welcomed to attend the monthly activities as an option for getting together.

Activities focus on three categories; fun, education or service. In 2023, 81% of Kinship' youth participated in at least one of the 13 hosted activities. Total attendance ranged from 12 to 55 and averaged 17 youth & 12 volunteers. Those volunteers contributed 660+ hours in 2023 building relationships through shared experiences at our hosted activities. Kinship participants submitted ideas & gave feedback on activities during the year on multiple surveys.

Our first activity was a February trip to Camp Shamineau near Motley. The group played broomball, climbed an ice tower, rode horse, snow-tubed, made leather crafts & played a host of indoor games. It was a blast on a "warm" winter day. We also held our Annual Meeting at the Little Falls American Legion Post, where the annual video & financial reports were presented.



390+ people attended our annual Fish Fry fundraiser held a the Little Falls VFW in March. Thank you to the 34 volunteers (both youth & adult) who helped to make it possible. After all, every gathering of Kinship folks is about building relationships through shared experiences. That includes working side-by-side to raise funds for Kinship!

Kinship enjoyed an evening of bowling fun in April at Bennington's Entertainment Center (formerly Little Falls Bowling Center). This has become a thoroughly enjoyed annual tradition.



May saw the return of Kinship folks picking roadside trash after a 10+ year hiatus! We met at the Falls Ballroom and then picked 2 1/2 miles of Hawthorn Road (by the fairgrounds). Kinship youth & volunteers worked side-by-side through this service project and found an amazing amount of trash in the ditches of that county road!

Despite the summer drought, we were able to canoe a stretch of the Mississippi on a beautiful evening in June, thanks to the support of Camp Ripley's MWR (Morale, Wellfare & Recreation) program as they supplied the canoes, trailers, paddles & life jackets. The paddlers journeyed from Camp Ripley to Belle Prairie park, where the evening ended with kickball, frisbee golf, playground fun & a picnic.

The St. Cloud Rox Baseball Foundation made a wonderful July baseball experience possible through an extremely generous donation of tickets & a ball-



park buffet for our group! Later that month, Kinship folks volunteered at the United Way brat sale at Coborns as a "thank you" for their ongoing financial support. This was our second service project for the year.

In August & September we hosted our nine-night, firearms safety course at both the Historic Courthouse & the Eastern Morrison County Sportsman's Club. This continues to be a valuable, hands-on educational course to teach real-life skills to the participants!

As our final summer activity, we traveled by bus to Northland Kart Kountry (north of Brainerd) for an evening of go-carting, mini golf, batting cages, bumper cars, virtual reality games, bungee bouncing & more.

The fall had two activities which were cancelled. The first was a Sunday afternoon of fishing on the Mississippi which was cancelled due to forecasted rain, wind & cool temperatures. This cancellation has led to discussion about how to better prepare Kinship's youth to "Do Hard Things" by being equipped to handle safe, but uncomfortable conditions, like fishing in the rain:) The second cancelled activity was an "Amazing Race at the Farm," which was cancelled due to an unforeseen out-of-town work conflict for the property owner.



October ended with a very successful Soup & Chili Cookoff fundraiser at the Falls Ballroom with 350+ people in attendance. Just like the fish fry, we leaned heavily on our youth & adult volunteers, of which there were 41, in addition to 20 additional community volunteers. This multitude of helpers filled roles ranging from hauling soup to selling tickets and from baking breadsticks to counting ballots.

We kicked off the Christmas season with a Santa's Workshop thanks to the Kinship volunteers who planned & hosted different craft & ornament making stations. Santa made a visit and handed out gifts courtesy of the LF American Legion.

During Christmas break we held our highest attended activity of the year, a night at The Falls Theatre to share the experience of watching the animated film "Migration." Kinship's group mentoring activities in 2023 continued to make a difference... one friendship at a time.

Kinship's Financial Accountability Process

According to MN Statutue 11.309.53(3), a charitable organization with total annual revenues over \$750,000 must file an audited financial statement prepared by an independent CPA.

Kinship's annual revenues falls well below this threshold, so the Board of Directors has taken the responsibility to ensure financial accountability for Kinship's revenue & expenses through ongoing board reports and an annual internal review by the Board Treasurer.



All of Kinship's finances are managed through Quickbooks (financial software) to provide accuracy, accountability & the ability to produce on-demand reporting & details.
