#### THANK YOU VOLUNTEERS

Monday, November 3rd Kinship volunteers gathered for a "Thank You" evening out. The crisp late fall outing took place at Cary's on the Course; the newly remodeled facility located on the site of the Little Falls golf course. The facility and friendly, helpful staff did not disappoint. Volunteers were comfortable in the fireplace room and enjoyed dinner selections that were impressive and delicious.

Once or twice a year Kinship hosts Mentor Nights Out (MNO) which are similar gatherings in that they are open to volunteers who are encouraged to invite prospective new mentors to learn a little more about what Kinship does and who we serve. The MNO's also have discussions and an educational component in efforts to help equip mentors to better meet the changing needs of the boy or girl they mentor.

This evening was simply a Thank You to our volunteers. In today's climate of insane busyness, many of our volunteers hold more than one job in or outside of the home. Some are primary caretakers for young or aging family members. Regardless of other commitments and full plates, Kinship mentors are a unique breed of caring individuals who make time for a kid; or make the choice to share time with a kid.

Volunteers were treated to hearing from a kinkid's mom, Stephanie, who credits Kinship mentors Collin and Kayla Backowski for helping her keep her son Keahi not only on the straight and narrow, but keeping him engaged in his education (and graduating!). Hard to keep a dry eye when you hear directly from a parent the effect that a positive role model has had on her son, and in turn, her family. This mentoring relationship help set a strong foundation for values like a decent work ethic, sacrificing for others, and being motivated to try to be and do better.

Foster mom of three kinkids Shannon also shared how invaluable Kinship mentors have been for her 'kids'. Her perspective was unique in that she too is meeting the needs of kids who don't live with both parents, but hers is a much more involved commitment.

To listen to Shannon talk about how Kinship mentors have affected the lives of the kids she's opened her home to was to see the magic of mentoring come to life. Like in other home situations, foster families benefit from their kids having other involved, invested adults who care about their kids.

Part-time staff member and mentor Becky shared a big "Thank You" from yet another perspective; one from someone who grew up in a single parent home where there was no Kinship program or mentor who stepped up to the plate. She reminded volunteers that it is an unfair and incorrect stereotype to think kids who come from broken, abusive, or single parent homes will turn out to be broken adults. On the contrary, many kids from wounded childhoods become the very people they wished they would have had in their own young lives. She reminded Kinship volunteers that the influence and impressions they make with their kinkid are invaluable and will outlive them as a volunteer.

Craig Miller from Kinship, Inc. closed the evening up with additional words of appreciation, a little insight into Kinship beyond Morrison County, and an invitation for potentially interested individuals to consider serving on the board of directors for Kinship, Inc.

Volunteers left with a special Thank You gift and hopefully a reminder of how vital and valuable they are.
