#### 🐚 Important Reminder About Business Hours & Pick-Up

Families, we kindly remind you that Rise and Shine's business hours are firm:

- Monday: 8:30 AM 12:30 PM
- Tuesday Friday: 8:30 AM 4:30 PM

We cannot allow late pick-up. Our late pick-up fee is in place as a deterrent and should not be viewed as an option. Recently, we have experienced an unusual number of late pick-ups, which creates a domino effect for our staff and their families. In addition, on Monday afternoons our staff are required to participate in training, making timely pick-up especially critical.

We ask that each family honor your contract agreement with Rise and Shine and make arrangements to ensure children are picked up on time every day. Your cooperation helps us maintain a smooth program for all.

#### Reminder: One Family at a Time for Drop-Off & Pick-Up

Per Rise and Shine policy, only one family may sign in or out at a time. Please do not crowd at the entrance. During drop-off and pick-up, staff are exchanging important information with families—sometimes private or sensitive—and it is essential that these conversations remain respectful and uninterrupted.

In the mornings, our staff are also completing health checks and receiving details about each child's routine and expectations for the day. This takes time and focus. We ask that parents plan for potential delays and allow the family ahead of you to complete their check-in/out before approaching the sign-in table.

Farm-to-Table Rainbow Plate Challenge Y Activity Overview:

Families create a "Rainbow Plate" at home together by choosing at least 3–5 colorful fruits or vegetables (farm-fresh if possible). The goal is for infants, toddlers, and parents to work side-by-side exploring colors, textures, and tastes.

Steps:

- 1. Shop or Harvest Together Visit a local farmers' market, grocery store, or use items from your home garden. Encourage your child to help pick out colorful produce (e.g., red strawberries, orange carrots, green cucumbers, purple grapes, yellow squash).
- 2. Wash & Explore Let your infant or toddler help wash the produce. Encourage touching, smelling, and naming the colors.
- 3.Build the Rainbow Plate Arrange the foods in rainbow order on a plate or tray. Toddlers can help sort by color and place them in rows.
- 4.Taste & Talk Sample each item as a family. Talk about the flavors (sweet, crunchy, soft, juicy). Infants can gum soft fruits/veggies or taste small, mashed portions.
- 5. Family Snapshot Take a photo of your "Rainbow Plate" masterpiece and your family enjoying it together.

#### Why It's Great:

- Builds color recognition and early math skills (sorting).
- Encourages healthy eating habits and curiosity about fruits/veggies.
- Strengthens family bonding through shared discovery.
- Infants/toddlers learn through sensory play (touch, taste, smell, sight).

#### Share Your Rainbow!

We invite families to send us a video or photo of their Rainbow Plate or a short note about their child's favorite fruit/veggie. We'll create a "Farm to CACFP Family Gallery" to showcase everyone's colorful creations! This will be shared on our website and social media platforms as well.
