

# **SOCIAL MEDIA INFLUENCERS**

## **1. Content Creation Equipment**

- **Cameras:**
    - DSLR, mirrorless cameras, action cameras (ex: GoPro), and vlogging cameras.

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## 5. Set Design and Workspace

- **Studio Rentals:**
    - Fees for renting spaces for photoshoots or video production.
  - **Backdrops and Decor:**
    - Green screens, custom backdrops, or decorative items for set design.
  - **Home Office Deduction:**
    - If part of your home is used exclusively for content creation or managing social media accounts, you can deduct a portion of rent, utilities, and maintenance.
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## 6. Internet and Communication

- **Internet:**
    - A portion of your internet costs used for uploading content or managing accounts.
  - **Phone Bills:**
    - A percentage of your phone bill used for calls, social media apps, or email communication.
  - **Mobile Apps:**
    - Subscriptions to apps for editing, analytics, or managing social media content.
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## 7. Marketing and Promotion

- **Social Media Advertising:**
    - Paid promotions on platforms like Instagram, TikTok, Facebook, or YouTube.
  - **Website Costs:**
    - Domain registration, hosting fees, and website design for a personal blog or portfolio.
  - **Promotional Materials:**
    - Business cards, flyers, or branded merchandise.
  - **SEO Tools:**
    - Subscriptions to platforms like SEMrush or Ahrefs to optimize visibility.

- **Online Courses:**
    - Classes on content creation, marketing, or social media growth.

- **Fitness Costs:**

- **Liability Insurance:**

- **Giveaways and Contests:**
    - Prizes, shipping costs, or items used for audience engagement.

  - **Charitable Contributions:**
    - Donations made on behalf of your brand (deductible if not tied to a specific product promotion).
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## 17. Depreciation

- **Equipment Depreciation:**

  - Depreciation of renovations or improvements to filming spaces.
