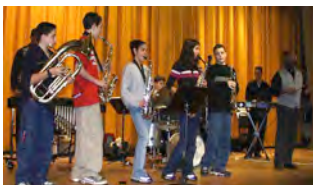

History, performance, or workshop of the 1950s steel pan music. Strongly identified as an important element of Trinidadian culture which greatly enhanced its social "respectability." During the 1960s, steel drums came of age with numerous steel pan festivals and competitions,

even performing for Queen Elizabeth. They played an important role during Trinidad's independence celebrations in 1962. Steel bands started touring the U.S. and the U.K.; on February 22, 1963, the first National Panorama competition was held in Trinidad. Steel Pan program for general audiences!
