

Corps History by Ed Dahling for Joe Wright, Historian

1 October 1880

John Phillip Sousa named 17th Director of the Marine Corps Band.

1 October 2001

General Peter Pace becomes first Marine to serve as Vice Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. 6 October 2008 The first Marine Special Operations Individual Training Course begins at Camp Lejeune, NC.

7 October 2001

The War in Afghanistan began as the armed forces of the United States, the United Kingdom, Australia, and the Afghan United Front (Northern Alliance) launched Operation Enduring Freedom.

14 October 1918

Marine flyers, 2nd Lieutenant Ralph Talbot and Gunnery Sergeant Robert G. Robinson, win Medals of Honor.

16 October 1820

Lieutenant Colonel Anthony Gale, 4th Commandant of the Marine Corps, having been found guilty of habitual drunkenness and conduct unbecoming an officer and a gentleman by a General Court Martial, was dismissed from the Marine Corps.

17 October 1820

Archibald Henderson appointed Commandant...a position he held until his death, a period of 38 years.

23 October 1983

At 0622, an explosive-laden truck slammed into the BLT headquarters building in Beirut, Lebanon, and took the lives of 241 Americans – including 220 Marines. This was the highest loss of life in a single day for Marines since D-Day on Iwo Jima in 1945.

31 October 1955

Lieutenant General Lewis B. 'Chesty' Puller, who earned five Navy Crosses – and an Army Distinguished Service Cross – retires

Big change to boot camp: Recruits will spend two weeks in 'Phase 4'

Making Marines at boot camp is a sacred mission that the Corps rarely changes.

But the commandant is revising the schedule for the 12-week regiment to make sure that new Marines can succeed in follow-on training.

Starting in February, Marines will have an extra week following the Crucible to learn from drill instructors, Marine-to-Marine, Gen. Robert Neller told Marine Corps Times in an exclusive interview. The number of training days will remain the same.

Currently, Marines earn their eagle; globe and anchor after completing the Crucible during the 11th week of recruit training.

The Crucible is 54 hours of combat drills, during which recruits get little sleep as they are put through simulated attacks day and night. Recruits learn they need to scream to be heard over the simulated gunfire, and that any illumination can give away their positions.

When recruits arrive at Parris Island and San Diego in November, they will face the Crucible during the 10th week of boot camp so that they will have two weeks to adjust to being Marines before leaving the recruit depots, officials said. Instead of being called "Marine Week," the time after boot camp will be called "Phase 4" of recruit training.

U.S. Mint Unveils WWI Centennial Coin and Medals:

The U.S. Mint this week unveiled a new collectible commemorative coin to mark the 100th anniversary of America's entry into World War I. The limited edition, WWI Centennial Silver Dollar, is expected to be available for purchase for around \$60 each beginning in January 2018, with \$10 per coin going to help construct the VFW-supported World War I Memorial a block away from the White House. Also announced were five silver medals representing the five branches of the armed forces that served during the Great War: Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Service and Coast Guard. Details are still coming, but the silver medals are not expected to be sold individually, but instead paired with a WWI Centennial Silver Dollar and offered as a special set. Additional information will be available prior to their release in 2018.

HBOT update:

Dr. Beckman reports that the funds donated to the TreatNOW Coalition by our Detachment are being used to treat one of our wounded Marines who is showing great progress. And as a result of stunning success the Coalition has had with treating active duty Force Recon Marines, the backlog of brain-wounded Marines seeking help continues to grow through the quite word-of-mouth grapevine that help is available. Sadly, DOD and the VA and the services will not pay for those treatments. We are dependent on the kindness-of-strangers and donors to raise the money to give the wounded what they deserve: a quality of life denied them by their invisible wounds.

The TreatNOW Coalition of over 60 Hyperbaric Oxygen clinics across the USA reports continuing success treating and helping to heal TBI/PTSD/ Concussion. Since 2010, TreatNOW has successfully treated over 2,544 brain injuries { with or without PTSD}. The majority of those treatments were done pro bono. Over 1,314 of those success stories were veterans. And continuing research worldwide confirms the safety, effectiveness and economy of using HBOT for brain injuries. VA Photo ID Cards for All Veterans Coming in November

All honorably discharged veterans of every era will be able to get a photo identification card from the Department of Veterans Affairs starting in November due to a law passed in 2015.

The law, known as the Veterans Identification Card Act 2015, orders the VA to issue a hard-copy photo ID to any honorably discharged veteran who applies. The card must contain the veteran's name, photo and a non-Social Security identification number, the law states.

A VA official on Wednesday confirmed the cards are on track to be available nationwide starting in November. Veterans may apply for the card online, but a timeline for how long it will take to receive a card after application has not been finalized, the official said.

No details were released on when that application process will open, what information veterans will need when applying or the web address they will use.

Although the law states that the VA may charge a fee for the card, the official said no fee is planned.

Honorably discharged veterans will soon get to shop tax-free

Hey veterans, you can soon shop tax free.

Starting later this year, all honorably discharged veterans, no matter their branch of service, will be eligible to shop tax-free online at the Army & Air Force Exchange Service with the same discounts they enjoyed on base while in the military. It's the latest way in which the organization is trying to keep its customers as the armed forces shrink and airmen and soldiers buy more for delivery.

Adding 13 million potential new customers will give extra ammunition to the group that runs the stores on U.S. Army and Air Force bases worldwide as it fights Amazon and other retailers for veterans' online shopping dollars.

The Exchange, which is part of the Defense Department, reported earnings of \$384 million last year. That's a sharp contrast from five years ago when Shull arrived to projections of \$180 million in losses.

Shull feels those are good reasons for the new online shopping privileges to draw veterans to do their shopping there.

"Veterans value the cost savings and what they can do to support the military," he said.
