PERRY POINT — After more than a decade's worth of deliberating a future for dozens of empty houses at the Perry Point VA Medical Center, officials broke new ground on Saturday for a project designed to house veterans at risk of homelessness in the coming years.

Hogan and Hornberger were joined at the groundbreaking by a number of other officials, including Holt and Thomas Hameline, the president and CEO of HELP USA. Sabrina Clark, the director of voluntary service at the Department of Veterans Affairs, sang the national anthem while Adam Robinson Jr., the director of the VA Maryland Health Care System, gave special remarks.

The 75 new housing units will come in the form of both renovated homes and period recreations. Thirty-three buildings will be constructed into 66 one-bedroom apartments; eight buildings will be turned into eight two-bedroom apartments; and one building will be converted to a three-bedroom apartment.

Corps History

2 May 1946

Marines from Treasure Island Marine Barracks, under the command of **Warrant Officer Charles L. Buckner**, helped suppress three-day prison riot at Alcatraz Penitentiary in San Francisco Bay,

3 May 1898

Marines from the U.S.S. Baltimore raise the Stars and Stripes over the Cavite Naval Station.

5 May 1961

Marine pilots retrieved America's first astronaut, **Navy Commander Alan Shepard**.

6 May 1937

Marines at NAS Lakehurst, NJ helped rescue Hindenburg survivors.

8 May 1995

In the wake of the most devastating storm to hit the New Orleans area in more than 200 years, a group of Marines and sailors from Marine Forces Reserve assisted in the evacuation of 2,500 civilians and medical treatment of flood victims

15 May 1862

Corporal John Mackie, the first Marine to earn the Medal of Honor, was commended for service on the USS GALENA during action against Confederate shore batteries at Drewry's Bluff, which blocked the James River approaches to Richmond.

16 May 1945

The 22nd and 29th Marines continued the attack against Half Moon Hill, a day characterized by the 6th Marine Division as the 'bitterest' of the Okinawa campaign. By the 18th, the famed 'Shuri line' had been broached.

.23 May 1988

The V-22 Osprey, the world's first production tilt-rotor aircraft, unveiled at Bell Helicopter facilities in Arlington, TX.


Second I'd like to congratulate **Ray Sturm** on being selected as our Detachment's **Marine of the Year**, which I believe is well deserved and past due.

An unknown party has set up a phone line that may be intended to deceptively reach veterans trying to contact the Veterans Choice Program (VCP), according to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. Veterans attempting to reach the VA program that allows them to receive health care in their own communities, may be mistakenly calling a "mimic" phone line, which is an 800 number, rather than the correct toll free line, which features an 866 area code. 
