## ATTENTION:



## **Corps History**

#### **1 April 1945** 1st & 6th Marine Divisions land on Okinawa.

#### 2-3 April 2003

5th Marine Regimental Combat Team captures bridges over Tigris River to open the path to Baghdad.

#### 3 April 1945

Marines of the III Amphibious Corps effectively cut Okinawa in half in three days rather than the originally projected eleven.

#### 8 April 1956

Six recruits drown in Ribbon Creek at MCRD Parris Island.

#### 9 April 1942

105 Marines among American captives on Bataan Death March.

#### 13 April 2003

Marines locate seven American soldiers held prisoner by the Iraqis near Samarra.

#### 14 April 1865

Marines guard the body of **John Wilkes Booth** after the assassination of **Abraham Lincoln**.

#### 15 April 1962

Marine Corps operational involvement in the Vietnam War begins, when HMM-362 arrives at Soc Trang in the Delta south of Saigon – as part of **Operation Shufly** – to air-lift Vietnamese troops into battle.

#### 18 April 1983

A Marine Security Guard is killed and seven wounded when a large car bomb explodes just outside the U.S. Embassy in Beirut, Lebanon.

#### 19 April 1995

**Captain Randolph A. Guzman** and **Sergeant Benjamin L. Davis** are killed when the Alfred Murrah Federal Office Building is bombed in Oklahoma City, OK.



#### U.S. honors Veterans on first official National Vietnam War Veterans Day

On March 29, 1973, the last American combat troops left Vietnam and returned home. Unlike troops of more recent wars, the vast majority of those brave service members did not receive a warm welcome. In fact many were spat upon, called names and treated with disdain.

Vietnam Veterans bore the horrors of battle in Vietnam only to come home to shoulder the burden of an unpopular war that was no fault of their own. The way they were treated has often been called a national disgrace and rightly so. They did their duty because their country asked them to. That's what patriots do, they serve when their nation calls.

Today, 44 years later, they are getting some of the recognition they earned so long ago.

Last night, the president signed the "Vietnam War Veterans Recognition Act of 2017" into law designating March 29 as National Vietnam War Veterans Day.

The law amends title 4 of the U.S. Code "to encourage the display of the flag of the United States on National Vietnam War Veterans Day" – the simple language creates both the day and encourages the flag to be flown in their honor each year.

#### Finally.

The bipartisan legislation, co-authored by Indiana Sen. Joe Donnelly and Pennsylvania Sen. Pat Toomey, is the first federal statute to both recognize Vietnam Veterans and create an annual recognition. The legislation passed in the House March 21 and in the Senate Feb. 3. Today, VA recognized March 29 with wreathlaying ceremonies at national cemeteries and other facilities across the country.



The wreath-laying ceremony will feature two wreaths — one for the 80 airmen who flew the historic mission, and one for the estimated 200,000 Chinese civilians who were executed for helping the Raiders after they landed on the east coast of China.

The ceremony will also feature a 20-foot Doolittle Raiders Wall of Honor with photos of the airmen, of whom only one remains, retired Air Force Lt. Col. Richard "Dick" Cole, now 101. No reservations are necessary to attend the commemoration.

**COMMANDANT:** Commandant Sturm reported there were 792 Toys for Tots Campaigns Nationwide, collecting 18 million toys, helping 7 million children. Of the 792 campaigns, there were 178 individual detachments collecting toys. The MCL Detachments alone collected 4.5 million toys helping 1.5 million children. Detachment 1049 is not a part of these numbers as we are collecting toys under the Fort Meade group.

Commandant Sturm reported on IRS policy. A Corporation many only donate to a 501©3 organization to get a tax exempt. The Marine Corps League is a 501©4. Individuals may donate to a 501©3 or 501©4 to get a tax exemption on their taxes. There was a corporation that donated to a MCL thinking they could use them as a tax write-off. IRS investigated and now the corporation is suing the MCL detachment to recover the donated funds. Note: Our paperwork states "donation may be tax deductible." Please be sure you do not misrepresent.

The National Marine Corps League is getting a new database and set of by-laws. The current bylaws are very lengthy but will be shortened to @30 pages. Most of the current bylaw will be moved to Administrative procedures.
