

## Commandant Ray Sturm

Greetings,

.Winter took a swipe at us but spring is right around the corner. That means we will be getting busy once again. I'll have a lot to report on here goes...

First, I want to welcome our newest members. If you see them at the Post, please say hello to **John Jordan**, **Cpl Ziadeh Suhail**, and **LCpl Jonathan Mosley**. Welcome aboard Marines.

I'd like to report on the Mid-Winter Conference in Fredericksburg. The first presentation came from LtGen Henry Osman, the CEO of Toys For Tots. He gave a national perspective on the 2016 program. Nationally, there were 792 campaigns. A total of 18 million toys were collected and distributed to 7 million kids. Of those, 278 campaigns were by MCL detachments. (Technically, ours falls under the Marines at Fort Meade.) Leaguers collected 4.5 million toys and distributed them to 1.5 million kids. He noted that 97% of all monies raised goes to the kids. Salary for the executive staff is \$0. Even he is a volunteer. What a great program. I'm very proud of this detachment's coordinators, **Pete Smith** and **Christine Stevens**.

I should also report that after another round of city presentations, the 2018 National Convention will be held in Buffalo, NY. The city has undergone a revitalization and is in the Niagra Falls area. It's about a 6.5 hour drive by car.. and is accessible by plane, train, bus, and submarine. They promised that by August, the term "lake effect" is no longer used in weather reports.

Also announced was that we no longer have to bring the Detachment Colors to a convention in order to get a streamer. Any delegate present can bring home the streamer. Considering the cost to replace if lost, and weight of the Colors, this is a great idea.

National is also working on a new set of by-laws in order to get IRS compliant. These new by-laws will be much shorter with most of the current content being shifted to the administrative procedures. There will be some issues with this to be sure, but it must be done. National must be run like a business, not a 'good ol' boys club.'

Planning is well underway for the **2017 golf tournament**. It's not too late to volunteer to assist. We can use the help. Please contact either Christine Stevens or myself if interested.

A planning meeting is scheduled for 28 March for the **2<sup>nd</sup> Annual 5K Challenge**. This year's event will be at Arundel Mills on 9 Sept. Again, we can use your help.

The **Marine Visitation Program** is up and running. We have met with several Marines in local nursing homes. We are starting small, but it has been great to chat with these Old Corps Marines.

And now a small plug to help our Quartermaster. You may now order your new detachment shirts and baseball cap. The long and short sleeve shirts feature our new detachment logo and cost \$30 each. The hat has a modified logo and costs \$20. They look sharp. You will want yours.

#### 3 March 1776

First Marine landing on hostile shores in the Bahmas.

#### 8 March 1965

**9th Marine Expeditionary Brigade** lands at DaNang, Republic of Vietnam – first U.S. ground combat troops committed to that conflict.

#### 11 March 1778

Marines aboard the frigate **BOSTON**, assisted in the engagement and capture of the British merchant ship MARTHA. Future **President John Adams** seized a musket and joined the Marines on deck until the frigate's commanding officer, **Captain Samuel Tucker**, sent him below for safety.

#### .13 March 1943

First Women Marine officer candidates arrive at U.S. Midshipmen School at **Mount Holyoke College**.

#### 21 March 1945

General **A.A. Vandegrift**, 18th Commandant, becomes first Marine four-star general on active duty.

#### 25 March 1804

Secretary of the Navy approves first formal Marine Corps uniform.

#### 26 March 1945

**Iwo Jima** secured. Marines suffer 25,851 casual-ties.

#### 31 March 1801

Lt. Colonel Commandant **William W. Burrows** & President **Thomas Jefferson** select site for Marine Baracks, 8th & I.

## Legislative Officer

#### New Bill Would Bring Much Needed Accountability to the VA

**Arlington, VA –** Today Rep. Phil Roe (R-TN), chairman of the House Veterans Affairs Committee, introduced the <u>VA Accountability First Act of</u> 2017. If passed, the bill would make it easier to terminate bad employees at the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and help bring a new culture of accountability to the broken department.

The 2017 VA Accountability First Act would drastically shorten the overall termination and appeals process for VA employees who are found to have engaged in misconduct. Currently, that process can take months or even years. The bill also empowers the VA Secretary to recoup bonuses awarded in error or given to employees who were later found to have engaged in misconduct. Additionally, it also gives the VA Secretary the ability to reduce the pensions of VA employees who are convicted of felonies that influenced their job performance.

The VA Accountability First Act of 2017 also contains language that ensures that these new powers for the VA Secretary cannot be used against whistleblowers who speak up about wrongdoings at the VA.

Chaplain's Corner Bill Collins

The Marines Helping Marines activity suspended operations as of 31 December 2016 due to the reduced number of in-patient combat wounded needing assistance .... THANK GOD....That is great news however; the number of veterans diagnosed with Traumatic Brain Injuries (TBI's) and associated Post traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) continues to rise. These injuries are related to exposure to blasts from road side bombs, RPG's, breeching, concussions and repeated and prolonged exposure to combat. Although invisible these brain injuries are devastating.....they are the primary contributors to the tragic suicide epidemic that is taking the lives of so many of our veterans. Current "approved" treatment protocols for TBI'S & PTSD are primarily drug based. The same drugs that list suicidal inclination as a side effect. A treatment that does not involve dependence on drugs is available. Hyperbolic Oxygen Therapy (HBOT) has been proven to be effective in the vast majority of those treated and has not induced any suicides....the same cannot be said for current drug based treatment. Our detachment is working with the Treat Now Coalition to add HBOT to the approved list of treatments available for treating TBI's & PTSD. This would mean that those diagnosed with brain injuries could choose HBOT and be reimbursed for the cost of their treatments. In order to support the HBOT effort and to support the Semper Fi Fund which provides lifetime support to post 9/11 wounded, critically ill, and injured members of all branches of the U.S. Armed Forces. Funds raised from this and future tournaments will go to the Semper Fi Fund and the Treat Now Coalition.

## Fort Meade: Battalion receives heritage and history lesson from WWII vet

Lt. Lou Schott, 96, was part of the A Company 1st Battalion 5th Marines during WWII and fought in the Battle for Iwo Jima.

Wearing a Marines cap adorned with the Purple Heart, 96-year-old Lou Schott watched as 40 mem-

bers of Headquarters Company, Marine Cryptologic Support Battalion fired rifles, shotguns and pistols used in World War II.

Schott, a retired colonel who served in the battles of Peleliu and Okinawa, was the guest lecturer during a professional military education event on Jan. 25 led by the battalion to learn about Marine Corps history during World War II.

The four-hour event was hosted by the Old Post Rifle and Pistol Club at the Associated Gun Clubs of Baltimore in Marriottsville, and featured a catered lunch by Mission BBQ.

A Department wide Leadership Training Class is scheduled to be held 18 April 2015 at the Glen Burnie VFW Post 160 (2597 Dorsey Road, Glen Burnie, MD 21061) home of the Anne Arundel County Detachment. This will be our 5th Annual Class. The objective of this class is to educate and familiarize Marines with the duties and responsibilities of Detachment Officers and to expand the Marines knowledge of National, Department and Detachment operations.

The Saturday Class will begin at 0800 and conclude at 1600. The cost of the class is \$35.00 per student, payable in advance with the registration. This will cover morning coffee, pastry, lunch and printed materials. Detachments may wish to pay this fee for their Marines attending. I would suggest that the Detachments have the Marines pay and reimburse them when they return with a diploma. This will stop Marines from not showing up for the class after the Detachment paid. **EARLY REGISTRATION IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED**, as the class will be limited to 30 students. Billets will be on first come first served basis. I expect this class to be filled. Applications should be mailed as early as possible. Enrolment will end on 31 March 2015. Our goal is to have as many Leaguers as possible attended the class.

If there is a cancellation, the opening goes first to the Detachment of the Marine that canceled. If no Marine from that Detachment is able to attend, that spot will go to the waiting list. There are no refunds. Your book is printed and food was ordered for you.

There is a registration form enclosed. You may make more if you need them. Registered Marines will be sent directions and other necessary information along with their confirmation approximately two weeks before the class date.
