



1942

2 December

Carlson's Raiders neared the end of an epic 26 day patrol on Guadalcanal.

1943

26 December

1st Marine Division lands on Cape Gloucester, New Britain.

1947

1 December

The Corps' first helicopter squadron, HMX-1, was commissioned at Quantico, VA.

15 December

The Secretary of the Navy signed a Memorandum of Agreement with the State Department which laid the basis for the modern Marine Security Guard program at U.S. Embassies through-out the world.

1950

1 December

The 1st Marine Division began its bitter withdrawal from Yudamni, North Korea.

4 December

Lt. Colonel Raymond G. Davis led the 1st Battalion, 7th Marines into Hagaru-Ri, Korea after four days of intense fighting in the mountain passes against a numerically superior hostile force, clearing the way for the 5th and 7th Marines. Lt. Colonel Davis was awarded the Medal of Honor for his heroism.

24 December

Last elements of the 1st Marine Division departed Hungnam, North Korea.

1965

20 December

Operation Harvest Moon ended for Task Force Delta (2/7, 3/3, and 2/1). More than 400 Viet Cong were killed in action.

Our Detachment has enjoyed another successful year thanks to the participation of our members and the hard work and dedication of our fearless leaders. Next year promises to be even better.

As many of you know, I am working with the "TreatNOW Coalition". This organization, largely volunteer and pro bono, has built a collaborative nationwide network of civilian Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy (HBOT) clinics which have successfully treated thousands of Traumatic Brain injured TBI/PTSD Veterans and civilians. It has been proven that this treatment protocol has great promise for ending the epidemic of suicides that is taking at least twenty of our veterans every day. The suicide rate for Special Ops members including Force Recon Marines is twice the norm. These are the "Best of the Best", the "Tip of the Spear" yet, when they are in the grip of the depression caused by their invisible brain damaging wounds, even these exceptionally brave warriors are convinced that anything is better than living in the dark place created by their own wounded brains; too often the depression wins out. It does not need to be so. HBOT has been proven to help the vast majority of those treated and has not induced any suicides, the same cannot be said for "approved" drug based therapies. Yet, HBOT is not included as one of the approved treatment protocols. This must be corrected.

Christmas Trees Safety

When purchasing an artificial tree, look for the label "Fire Resistant"

When purchasing a live tree, check for freshness. A fresh tree is green, it's needles are hard to pull from branches and when bent between your fingers, needles do not break.

When setting up a tree at home, place it away from fireplaces, radiators or portable heaters. Place the tree out of the way of traffic and do not block doorways.

Cut a few inches off the trunk of your tree to expose the fresh wood. This allows for better water absorption and will help to keep your tree from drying out and becoming a fire hazard.

Be sure to keep the stand filled with water, because heated rooms can dry live trees out rapidly

So, what can you do to help? Go to the Treat-NOW.org website and become familiar with the issues related to the HBOT treatment protocol including the history of the extensive research that supports the efficacy of HBOT in the treatment of TBI/PTSD. Be prepared to support legislation to include HBOT as an approved treatment option for those diagnosed with TBI/PTSD. I have a meeting scheduled with State Senator Bryan Simonaire. The purpose of the meeting is to familiarize the Senator with HBOT and to enlist his support in introducing legislation to make HBOT available to all veterans who qualify for treatment. As Marines we must act. It is not good enough to say SEMPER FI to each other and do nothing when it is obvious that the system that is supposed to take care of our brothers and sisters is failing. I'll keep you posted and call on you for help as the way forward becomes clearer.

CHAPLAIN:

Acting Chaplain Fred Kaminski reported Charles Albo passed away, and family requested that there be no service.

Chaplain Bill Collins will be meeting with the State Senator and Veterans Administration to discuss the TBI suicide rate amongst veterans. Bill is working with an organization called TREATNOW on the use of the Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy to treat patients with TBI (traumatic brain injuries) or PTSD (post-traumatic stress syndrome). The FDA has not approved of the use of the HBOT yet, but it has proven to improve or heal those suffering. Bill suggested we check out TREATNOW.org for further information.

SENIOR VICE:

Senior Vice Ben Wells reported the covers that were ordered had not come in as of this meeting. They will be ready at the next meeting.

The raffle tickets are ready for the Maryland Department convention in Ocean City so pick up your tickets now so you can get your friends and relatives involved.

QUARTER MASTER:

Fred Kaminski read a poem in honor of Jim Brady.

.COLOR GUARD:

Color Guard Commander Woody Bowman reported he has one event scheduled this week at the Food Lion on Mountain Road. Colors will be presented. No other events are scheduled until March 2017. Woody reported the Color Guard participated in 9 events in 11 days with plenty of help. Woody stated 15 functions have been performed by the Color Guard since May.

NEW BUSINESS: Bill Collins asked for a \$100 donation for Healing Waters. (Healing Waters is an organization dedicated to the physical and emotional rehabilitation of disabled active military service personnel and disabled veterans through fly fishing and associated activities including education and outings.) Voted on and passed.

Commandant Ray Sturm had pictures of our new proposed logo designed by Bill Collins. Motion made to adopt this logo as our official logo. Voted on and passed unanimously. We are going to draft some shirts with the logo. Bill Collins stated the Marine Corps cannot apply a decal on any shirt not made in the USA. Jim Brady reminded the group that the detachment can only sell their decal items to their own detachment and not to the general public. You can give it away, but not sell.

Commandant Sturm asked for a motion to spend no more than \$50 to buy black material for a memorial drape. Motion made and passed.

Commandant Sturm recently made contact with the Baltimore Recruiting District. (Gunny Sergeant was supposed to be in attendance, but was working.) They are wishing to help Marine families with food baskets (ham / turkey) dinners and toys for their Christmas party. The families will be registered with Toys for Tots. Baltimore and Harford County detachments are also going to help with this. Edie Remines husband Rick will be Santa Claus. Jim Brady made a motion we donate \$500. It was second. Discussion on who the recipients were. Don Benson stated he thought it was for E-3 and below families, Young Marines, and Reservist. Original motion was voted on and passed. Commandant Sturm will contact the Captain at the Recruiting District to see exactly what is expected.

Commandant Sturm brought up the need for a storage container to place beside the building. The audience of this well-attended event included other Gold Star Families, Elected Officials, Veterans and Supporters.




