Don't forget our yearly ceremonies at the Crownsville Veterans Cemetery on Monday, 5/31/04 beginning at 1100 hrs. Also if you can help with the ceremonies with VFW Post #160 beginning at 0800 Hrs 5/31/04 it would be greatly appreciated. The Defense Dept. announced on 2/9/04 the creation of the Korean Defense Service Medal, authorized by PL 107-314. It is a service medal to give special recognition for the sacrifices and contributions made by members of the U.S. armed forces who have served or are serving in the Republic of Korea. Members of the armed forces authorized the KDSM must have served in support of the defense of the ROK. Eligibility, served 30 consecutive or 60 non-consecutive days in an area that encompasses all land area of the ROK. And the contiguous water out to 12 nautical miles, and all air spaces above the land and water areas. Eligibility Dates are 7/28/1954 to a future date determined by the secretary of defense. Korean vets served between 1950 and 53 are not eligible for this medal. The KSM was extended to 7/27/54. #### THE MEDAL OF HONOR



Sgt. Matej Kocak, 66th Co., Fifth Regiment, Second Div in action in the Viller-Corttertes section, south of Soissons, France, 18 July 1918. When a hidden machinegun nest halted the advance of his battalion, Sgt. Kocak went forward alone

unprotected by covering fire and worked his way in between the German positions in the face of heavy enemy fire. Rushing the enemy position with his bayonet, he drove off the German crew. Later the same day, Sgt. Kocak organized French colonial soldiers who had become separated from their company and led them in an attack on another machinegun nest which was also put out of action. For his heroism reflected the highest credit upon himself and the U.S. Marine Corps he was awarded his countries most distinguished honor.

I think men like him created the Marines First Devil Dogs.

Did you know The Gulf War, Desert Shield, against Iraq involved more U.S. Marines than any single operation in Marine Corps history? There were 92,990 Marines in the theater, organized in 24 combat battalions and 40 squadrons. The 5 month war was climaxed during Jan-Feb 1991 with a 38 day air campaign and a 4 day ground battle. 24 Marines had been killed, 92 Wounded, eight fixed-wing aircraft and 3 choppers were lost. A reporter who accompanied the 1st Bn., 5th Marines (Which fought at Belleau Wood, Peleliu and the Frozen Chosin called it the most lopsided victory in Marine Corps history.

Commandant Alfred M. Gray, Jr. once stated "The reason that the American people support the Marine Corps is credibility. Marines have done what they say they're going to do. And they did it in spades in the Gulf war. The future of the Corps rests in young, Marines' bands. He also stated that only' Marines are a profession. The rest of the services are occupations. Gen. Gray (Ret) He chewed tobacco, talked about, warriors and felt more at home in \ ... fatiques than dress blues. He can be seen' at the Mid Winter Conference at Fairfax, .: Va. Every February during the meetings. Yes, he is very approachable and will talk with you on any subject One on One. He has always been Known as a Marines' Marine.




