





Corps History

1 December 1947

The Corps' first helicopter squadron, **HMX-1**, was commissioned at Quantico. VA

5 December 1929

Marine **Captain A. N. Parker** was the first person to fly over unexplored Antarctica.

6 December 2006

Major Megan McClung, a 1995 Naval Academy graduate, became the 1st female Marine officer to be killed in Iraq and the fifth female Marine to die in support of Operations Iraqi Freedom & Enduring Freedom.

7 December 1941

Marines defend against Japanese 'sneak-attack' on U.S. Pacific fleet at Pearl Harbor. Over 3,000 Marines and Sailors were killed in that action.

8 December 1941

Marines of the 1st Defense Battalion and Marine Fighting Squadron 211 resisted Japanese attempts to invade Wake Island for over two weeks before finally succumbing to an overwhelming force.

10 December 1941

With no weapon larger than the .30 caliber machine gun,153 Marines defended Guam until overwhelmed.

15 December 1948

Secretary of the Navy signs a 'Memorandum of Agreement' with the State Department which laid the basis for the modern Marine Security Guard program at U.S. embassies throughout the world.

23 December 1941 Japanese forces launched attacks against Wake Island, Wilkes Island, and Peale Island. After nearly 12 hours of desperate fighting, the three islands were surrendered.

Maryland Vietnam War Stories

The Documentary...

Few conflicts in U.S. history have so divided the nation as did the Vietnam War. Yet, hundreds of thousands of men and women answered their country's call to fight in this unpopular war. More than 58,000 made the ultimate sacrifice, and hundreds of thousands more were injured – physically, psychologically, on both –coming back to a nation which spat upon

both –coming back to a nation which spat upon them or called them "baby killers." It was indeed a painful chapter in American history.

With time comes wisdom, and as the nation's collective consciousness admits the shameful treatment of service personnel, various initiatives have surfaced to redress the treatment of the Vietnam veteran. To recognize veterans' sacrifices, their valor, and the price they paid in and after this conflict, Maryland Public Television will air a three-hour documentary titled *Maryland Vietnam War Stories*, which allowed veterans themselves to speak of what they have seen and how they have served.

MPT's documentary comprises three hours of dramatic television as approximately 100 veterans tell the story of the war in their own words – sometimes heart breaking but always insightful. Men and women reflect on their service...on stories of life and death, pumping adrenaline, and bittersweet moments...on their return home to an often-ungrateful nation...on life, 50 years later. It will make for a powerful and emotional television experience for our viewers, informing them of a tumultuous time in American history while allowing our state's Vietnam veterans a moment to share the feelings they have kept inside for so many years.

The *Maryland Vietnam War Stories* documentary will air on three successive weeknights beginning at 8:00 PM on MPT-HD.

The air dates are Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, May 24 through May 26, 2016 Mark your calendars!

The Event...

LZ Maryland is a weekend event that will honor Vietnam veterans as they gather together with family, friends, and a grateful public.

"LZ" is for "landing zone," a place of safety. It's fitting that we salute Maryland's Vietnam-era veterans here where their roots are planted. Those in conflict knew that an LZ was a safe, clear, and ready place for helicopters to land without harm. MPT will make LZ Maryland reflect the same safety: This landing zone is secure from the hurt and



pain of the past. We have created a safe landing and welcome you home. We thank you for serving your country. We gather here – with you and your family and friends – to celebrate your service, valor, and sacrifice.

The two-day event includes:

The Tribute Ceremony... Tens of thousands of people from Maryland and mid-Atlantic states are expected to attend the LZ Maryland ceremony to salute and honor Maryland's Vietnam-era veterans. The event will feature presentation of colors, the national anthem, presentations, music, heartfelt sentiments of appreciation and much more.

Memorial Chair Ceremony... A powerful memorial of 1,015 white empty chairs will be placed at the center of the LZ Maryland village in silent tribute to the 1,015 Maryland veterans killed or missing in action. The chairs will be a conspicuous, moving salute to service members who did not return from the war.

The Honor Ride... Hundreds of members of veteran oganizations, associations, and clubs will participate in a motorcycle "Honor Ride" representing soldiers who either died in combat or are still missing. The riders will travel from various locations across Maryland and nearby states and enter the Maryland State Fairgrounds in formation as a salute to the fallen and missing.

The R&R Family Zone... A retreat for activities and performances that can be enjoyed by the entire family. Visit the Basic Training tent for some friendly competition, evoke your inner artist at the Craft Station, be entertained by the variety of performances at the *Utility Stage*, or sit back and relax at the shade tent.

LZ Maryland Market Place... will house more than 30 vendors selling their wares. From veteran artists to providers of authentic Vietnamese items, merchants will offer attendees a unique shopping experience. Select merchandise and apparel will be available.

MASH Unit... A replica of a fully functional hospital in a combat area of operations will be on display. Attendees will be able to tour the hospital and get a perspective of the conditions workers and wounded experienced more than 40 years ago.

LZ Maryland Mess Hall... From classic festival fare to traditional Vietnamese cuisine, the LZ Maryland Mess Hall is the one-stop shop for food and beverages. Alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages will be served. Swing by for a snack or stay for a meal and enjoy seating in one of many shade tents. A variety of Mess Halls will be available throughout the event site.

Wall of Faces ... This "wall" takes the form of a KIA/ MIA portable memorial bearing the name of each Maryland Vietnam veteran who was killed in or missing in action. Just as the Vietnam Veterans Memorial stands as a national symbol of healing and reconciliation, MPT hopes its KIA/MIA memorial, which will be placed near the white chairs described above, will be formal recognition of the Vietnam veterans who sacrificed their lives. After LZ Maryland, the portable memorial will be housed for viewing at MPT.

Veteran Art Gallery... Art as therapy has been adopted by many veterans as a way to deal with the traumatic experiences war can present. The LZ Maryland Veteran Art Gallery will house the works of dozens of talented Vietnam veterans. Artwork in this area is for display only; additional artwork will be available for sale in the Market Place.

Veteran Resources, Veteran Services and Veteran Seminar Tent... Veteran service organizations will be on hand to discuss various topics and connect veterans to valuable resources. Between seminars, counselors will be available to assist veterans, one-on-one, with advice on PTSD, Agent Orange, TBI and other concerns.

Writers Hooch... Attendees will have the opportunity to meet Vietnam veteran authors, participate in literary discussions and peruse many publications on the topic of the Vietnam era. Books from appearing authors will be on sale.

Reunion Lounge... This large lounge area provides a site where veterans and their families may reunite, relax and relate. Each reunion lounge will be clearly marked by division or year or location, so veterans who have that commonality will be brought together (*example: The Chu Lai Reunion Zone*). Sponsors of this area may engage with veterans in this lounge atmosphere and are encouraged to offer a benefit to the veterans.

LZ Maryland Screening Room ... Beat the heat and step into the air-conditioned LZ Maryland Screening Room.

This movie theater-style area allows attendees to view several Vietnam-related films, including Maryland Vietnam War Stories and PBS specials.

Vietnam Tour of Duty'Map... A map (roughly 100' x 120') of Southeast Asia will be one of the focal points of LZ Maryland and will positioned in a strategic spot on the grounds. The map will be manufactured so that veterans, family members and friends can walk on it, sign it, or make other notations. Veterans will possibly sign the places where they served, or they and family members might sign the places where fellow soldiers or loved ones made the ultimate sacrifice.

Motor Pool. Go back in time with this display of Vietnam era military vehicles. The display will include a variety of vehicles including jeeps, tanks, and more.

Entertainment... Performers on three stages will keep visitors entertained throughout the weekend. The main stage will be the focal point for ceremonies (Opening/Closing Ceremony, Tribute Ceremony, prayer service, etc.), headline talent, USO-style show, and regional bands throughout this two-day event. Two other stages will feature regional and local bands performing hits from the '50s, '60s, and '70s.

The event will take place at the Maryland State Fairgrounds, Timonium, MD on June 18 & 19, 2016 at the following times.

Saturday 10:00 AM – 10:00 PM Sunday 10:00 AM – 3:00 PM

NOTE – This is an edited version of information made available by MPT. As a participant in the filming of the documentary, I am anxiously awaiting the airing as I hope that many of you are. MPT is to be lauded for the amount of effort that they have put forth to make this project a reality.

It should also be mentioned that MPT was also a major player in the State of Maryland hosting a "Welcome Home Maryland Vietnam Veterans" event in Annapolis in April of this year, which capped festivities highlighted by Governor Hogan's signing of the associated legislation.


