Corps History

1 August 1960

The Corps' Enlisted Rank & Pay Structure Board revised existing rank structure by incorporating the rank of Lance Corporal and the E-8 and E-9 Pay grades.

2 August 1950

1st Marine Provisional Brigade lands at Pusan, South Korea.

3 August 1950

Eight Corsairs of VMF-214 the famed 'Black Sheep squadron of World War II, executed the first Marine aviation mission in the Korean War in a raid against enemy installations near Inchon.

6 August 1847

Marines commenced their march on the "Halls of Montezuma" in Mexico.

7 August 1990

President Bush ordered U.S. military aircraft and troops to Saudi Arabia as part of a multi-national force. One week later the Marine Corps announced the commitment of 45,000 troops to Operation Desert Shield – largest deployment of U.S. forces since Vietnam.

13 August 1918

Opha Mae Johnson became the first female Marine when she enlisted in the Marine Corps Reserve.

14 August 1945

President Truman announced Japan's unconditional surrender.

17 August 1942

2nd Marine Raider Bn under Lt. Colonel Evans F. Carlson landed on Makin Island and destroyed a seaplane base, two radio stations, a supply warehouse, and killed about 100 Japanese troops.

19 August 1919

The National Museum of the Marine Corps strives to ensure that all of its visitors have the opportunity to honor and appreciate the history of the U.S. Marine Corps. The History in Your Hands (HIYH) tour, led by trained Museum volunteers and visitors services staff, is an opportunity for visual-

It was once a common military belief that airplanes weren't useful to ground troops, but in 1912, First Lieutenant Alfred Austell Cunningham changed everything. He reported to Naval Aviation Camp in Annapolis, Maryland "for duty in connection with aviation," and two months later, he became the first Marine aviator. Over the next few years, the number of Marine aviators grew, and in 1915, the Commandant of the Marine Corps authorized the creation of a Marine Corps Aviation Company, comprised of 50 men.

With more than 100 years in service, there is plenty of Marine Aviation history to explore. Marine Aviation personnel have forged a legacy of courage in hostile skies around the globe. Whether it's becoming the first American astronaut to orbit the Earth or fighting enemy troops from jungle airstrips, these Marines are always paving the way. The National Museum of the Marine Corps invites you to join Family Day on Saturday August 8, 2015 from 12:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. to embrace the opportunity to learn more about the fascinating history of Marine Aviation. The Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-121, based in Yuma, Arizona, "is the first squadron in military history to become operational with an F-35 variant" and stands "ready for worldwide deployment" with 10 of the aircraft, according to the statement.

The F-35 is the Pentagon's most expensive weapons acquisition program, estimated to cost \$391 billion to purchase 2,457 aircraft for the Air Force, Marine Corps and <u>Navy</u>. The Corps will begin operational flights this year -- albeit with a less lethal version of the aircraft -- followed by the Air Force in 2016 and the Navy in 2019.
