



#### This Month in History Selected December Dates of Marine Corps Historical Significance

**7 December 1933:** Navy Department creates Fleet Marines Force.

**7 December 1937:** Marine Capt Evans Carlson goes to Yenan to observe communist Chinese armies in action.

**7 December 1941:** Marines try to fight back when Japanese attack U.S. Pacific fleet at Pearl Harbor. Marines at Tientsin and Peking are forced to surrender.

**28 December 1941:** Most of 4th Marines move from Bataan to Corregidor Island in Manila Bay. Fortress island falls 6 May 1942.

**9 December 1942:** Marine MajGen Alexander Vandegrift turns over command of Guadalcanal to Army.

**26 December 1943:** 1st Marine Division lands on Cape Gloucester, New Britain.

**20 December 1989:** Marines are part of force that tries to capture Panama's dictator, Manuel Antonio Noriega.

**21 December 1991:** Soviet Union disbanded and replaced by Commonwealth of Independent States.



# Legislative Jim LeGette

UPDATE regarding previous reported US Congressional bills:

HR 3769 – development of publicly accessible database in order for anyone to verify various military claims – to guard against "fake" heroes, has been introduced, on October 4, 2007, as the first step after proposal by Rep. John Salazar (D-CO).

Two other bills, in the US Senate, 2142 and 2162, both related to proposals to assist veterans with mental health issues were introduced, after proposal, on October 4<sup>th</sup> and October 15<sup>th</sup>, respectively.

The latest, by the Department of Veterans Affairs, about their attempt to reduce the backlog of 400,000 claims, has received some radical suggestions from various legislators. Some of the suggestions are directed at attempting to classify groups of veterans and placing them in a priority listing in order of preference. A concern is the loss of the human element when replaced by the development of technology to process the claims. It seems to be a difficult balancing of the two concerns.

The Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) offers military related license plates to veterans. To purchase a plate, go to your local MVA office. Fee: \$25.00

#### **Eligible Vehicles:**

Passenger Cars Multi-purpose vehicles Motorcycles Trucks (10,000 lbs or less)

#### You must submit:

Application for Military Related License Plates (form #VR-120) Application fee And one of the following: Discharge papers (Form DD-214)

### **Christmas Trees safety**

When purchasing an artificial tree, look for the label **"Fire Resistant "** 

When purchasing a live tree, check for freshness. A fresh tree is green, it's needles are hard to pull from branches and when bent between your fingers, needles do not break.

When setting up a tree at home, place it away from fireplaces, radiators or portable heaters. Place the tree out of the way of traffic and do not block doorways.

Cut a few inches off the trunk of your tree to expose the fresh wood. This allows for better water absorption and will help to keep your tree from drying out and becoming a fire hazard.

Be sure to keep the stand filled with water, because heated rooms can dry live trees out rapidly.

Make sure the base is steady so the tree won't tip over easily.

#### **Claims Assistance**

Veterans Benefit Service Program The Service Program of the Maryland Department of Veterans Affairs assists veterans and eligible dependents in acquiring their benefits. The staff of the Service Program is authorized to represent veterans and their dependents before the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, as well as provide general information to those seeking assistance, regardless of representation.

The Service Program currently has Service Officers located in communities throughout Maryland to aid and serve veterans and their eligible dependents. Contact the Program Office most convenient to you. Appointments may be scheduled through the Program Office nearest the itinerant location.

It pays to seek representation when filing claims for federal VA disability benefits. U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs data shows that veterans represented by accredited organizations receive significantly greater disability benefits than their non-represented counterparts.
