Unregulated chemicals have been discovered in some of the base drinking water systems at Camp Lejeune, NC. Therefore, the Marine Corps is actively seeking individuals who resided or worked aboard Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune between 1957 and 1987 for their notification registry. The Marine Corps is funding health studies to determine when the drinking water was first impacted, who may have consumed it, and whether or not there may be an association between exposure to the water and certain health conditions.

This Month in History
Selected November Dates of Marine
Corps Historical Significance

10 November 1775: Continental Congress authorizes two battalions of American Marines; the birthday of the Corps.

20 November 1856: Marines in landing party that captures four barrier forts guarding way to canton, China.

5 November 1903: Maj. John Lejeune lands battalion to ensure Panama's independence from Colombia.

12 November 1908: President Theodore Roosevelt removes Marines from warship, but six months later President Taft restores them.

10 November 1948: First eight enlisted women are sworn in as Regular Marines. The following summer, first black women Marines enlist.

18 November 1949: Corps orders all male Marines, regardless of race, be assigned to vacancies in any unit.

2 November 1950: Marines engage Chinese Communists in North Korea near the Chosin Reservoir.

23 November 1950: Thanksgiving day, 7th Marines take Yudam-ni.

28 November 1950: After repulsing eight Chinese division, Marines begin epic "breakout" on 1 December.

10 November 1952: Marine Corps War Memorial dedicated next to Arlington National Cemetery.

10 November 1975: Marine Corps celebrates its 200th birthday.

President Bush recently issued an Executive Order, which states the following:

"It shall be the policy of the United States to provide for the appropriately expedited recruitment and selection of spouses of members of the armed forces for appointment to positions in the competitive service."

This order allows agency heads to bypass competitive hiring regulations in order to appoint a spouse to a civilian government job. See tshoop@govexec.com (September 29, 2008) for more complete details.

The Department of Defense announced under the Military OneSource service, it has established a Wounded Warrior Resource Center which can be contacted through: (800) 342-9647 or wwrc@militaryonesource.com This new resource will make available a single contact that should be able to answer any health care questions regardless of service affiliation. This system will not replace the existing individual service resource centers.

One element of Tricare assistance, regarding a spouse, is the spouse, at the age of 65, must be enrolled in Medicare Part B in order to be eligible for Tricare for Life. If not enrolled in Part B, the spouse may lose the opportunity to obtain Tricare for Life. Contact the Tricare Service Center at (877) 874-2273 for clarification.

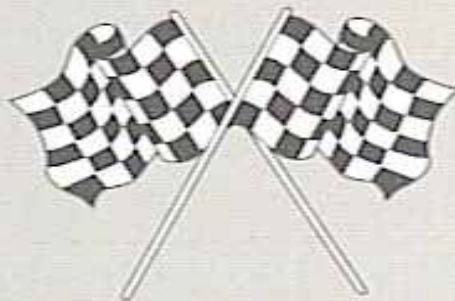
