This Month in History Selected May Dates of Marine Corps Historical Significance

- **31 May 1990:** Marines reach Chinese capital to defend legation quarter from Boxer rebellion.
- **22 May 1912:** 1stLt.alfred Cunningham is frist Marine aviator.
- **15 May 1916:** Marine Battalion begins occupation of Dominican Republic.
- **6 May 1946:** Commandant Archibald Vandegrift tells Senate Naval Affairs Committee "The bended knee is not a tradition of our corps."
- **23 May 1948:** First Marines brought ashore by helicopter for amphibious exercise a New River, North Carolina.
- **14 May 1975**: Marines board American container ship Mayaguez which Cambodians had seized.
- **12 May 1980**: Embassy Marines in San Salvador use tear gas to rescue U.S. Ambassador from mob.
- **30 May1997:** Marines help evacuate 2,500 from Kinshasa, Zaire.

The U.S. Senate Veterans Affairs Committee, in April, learned that 17 veterans (all services) commit suicide each month. Certain senators are calling for the resignation of Dr. Katz a mental health officer who failed to inform the committee of this suicide rate and the attempted suicide rate of about 1,000 per month. The senators are demanding the VA be more forthcoming with such information so that the congressional members can better support the agency through the proper funding to stem the suicide rate.

While the divided U.S. Senate battles over improvements to the Veterans Education Act, HR 5684 (subcommittee bill) in the House proposes certain increases of dollars for tuition/fees, a monthly stipend for living expenses and additional money to pay other federal education aid obligations. There is a deep void between the two houses regarding the proposed benefits for the year – the House \$595 Million and the Senate \$2 Billion.
