Photo Goes Viral

NOTE – The following article is an edited compilation of online articles appearing within The Marine Corps Times feature column Battle Rattle and Idaho's KVTB television's website.

This photo of **Staff Sergeant Jesse Cottle**, who lost his legs during a 2009 deployment to Afghanistan, has gone viral after the photographer, Sarah Ledford, posted it on her Face**book** page (Sarah Ledford / ShutterHappy Photography[™]).



Cottle told **KTVB** (an Idaho TV station) that he joined the Corps in 2003 and served as an explosive ordinance disposal Marine. He was on a foot patrol in Afghanistan in 2009 when he stepped on a pressure plate that triggered an improvised explosive device. The subsequent blast cost him his legs. Cottle said that he remembers almost everything about the attack, and that he was awake in the aftermath. He credits his recovery to being surrounded by good friends, family and his faith. He said he was lucky to be able to have the chance to go through the recovery as opposed to losing his life on the battlefield.

It was during his long recovery that he met his wife, Kelly, at a swim meet. The couple married in 2012 and they now live in San Diego, CA. They were recently in Idaho for Kelly's family's reunion, and that's when they had some family portraits taken.

When the photographer suggested they take a few photos in the water, Cottle popped his prosthetic legs off and his wife carried him on her back, which is how she said she helps him get around. "We do it all the time," Kelly said. "It's just pretty normal so he hopped on my back..."

Cottle's wife Kelly went on to say that *she feels like they* represent what a lot of people are going through after the wars.




Our detachment color guard *remains in need of some new members*... especially younger members *capable of marching in parades!*

2. An explanation was sought about why 'sponsor' advertisements appear in each issue of *the Cutting Edge*. The question essentially focused on *why are we absorbing production costs to produce the newsletter without collecting fees from those sponsors*.

Mac McNeir and Manny Airey pointed out that these sponsors provide foods, beverages, and their various products at either (1) their costs with no mark-up passed on to us or (2) at no cost to us at all. In just one example, the savings to the detachment is significant – many hundreds of dollars annually. It is felt by the out-going editor (Mac McNeir) that future exclusion of these ads, which are a small price to pay for what we get in return, would be counter-productive at best and potentially harmful should we have to pay fully for the products and services provided by these sponsors.

It should also be known that the production of the newsletter usually results in blank areas too small to allow insertion of complete stories on some pages; so, these 'free' ads are used to fill up those spaces and provide a more visually balanced/complete presentation.

Gary Sinise Named As Latest Honorary Marine

The "Forrest Gump" star who spends his free time entertaining military families became an honorary member of 'the few and the proud' last night.

The actor, **Gary Sinise**, known for his iconic portrayal of the sharp-tongued soldier *Lieutenant Dan* in the 1994 film and for his long run on the CBS series *CSI New York*, was recently made an honorary Marine in an intimate dinner ceremony at the home of **Marine Corps Commandant General James Amos**.

For the last two years, Sinise's eponymous nonprofit foundation has helped renovate veterans' homes, sent military spouses on vacations, and sponsored military scholarships. His **Lt. Dan Band** has traveled to military installations across the globe to provide free concerts to troops and their families – I've been to one, and I can tell you he's pretty good on the guitar.

A spokesman for Marine Barracks Washington, Captain Jack Norton, said Sinise was pinned with the Eagle, Globe, and Anchor, just like any new Marine. Sinise was also the 'Guest of Honor' at the Evening Parade at Marine Barracks 8th and I.



"This was one of the most extraordinary nights," Sinise said in a released statement." "I was totally surprised by what the general gave me tonight. I'm humbled, shocked, moved and motivated to keep standing up for our men and women and giving back to them."

In a statement, Amos praised Sinise's work on behalf of the troops.

"There is little I can say to enhance the rich reputation Gary Sinise has earned, both in the spotlight as an immensely talented actor, and less conspicuously as a tireless advocate for our men and women in uniform," he said. "What I can do, what I am privileged and proud to do, is to recognize this humble patriot's selfless service by making him an Honorary Marine."

This is the second honorary military induction in as many years for Sinise. In August 2012, the Navy made him an honorary Chief Petty Officer.



Sinise joins the likes of legendary 'bad-ass' Chuck Norris and comedian **Bob Hope** in earning the title of honorary Marine, which is given to those who have demonstrated Marine Corps qualities or distinguished themselves in service to the military.

According to a Marine Corps Community website listing, there have been 75 honorary Marines inducted since 1992, not counting cancer survivor **Daran Wankum**, who received the honor earlier this year.

1 September 1936

Mitchell Paige – Medal of Honor recipient for heroism during Guadalcanal campaign – enlists as a Marine in Baltimore, MD.

2 September 1945

Japanese officially surrendered to the Allies on board the battleship MISSOURI in Tokyo Bay. The senior Marine Corps representative at the historic ceremony was Lt. General Roy S. Geiger, CG, FMF Pacific.

6 September 1983

Two Marines were killed and two wounded when rockets hit their compound in Beirut, Lebanon. Heavy fighting continued for the **24th MAU** peacekeeping force near the International Airport.

8 September 1942

1st Raider Battalion and the **1st Parachute Battalion**, supported by planes of **MAG-23** and two destroyer transports, carried out a successful raid on a Japanese supply base on Guadalcanal.

9 September 1950

Captain L. E. Brown flew the first Marine combat jet mission in Korea.

10 September 1813

Marines serve with Commodore Matthew C. Perry during the Battle of Lake Erie.

11 September 1990

4th MEB arrives in Gulf of Oman to support Operation Desert Shield.

12 September 1917

General John J. Pershing selects the 7th Marines to guard his Headquarters in France.

13 September 1847

Marines help seize Mexico City fortress of Chapultepec.

13 September 1942

Marines repulse Japanese attack in **Battle of Edson's Ridge** on **Guadal-canal**.

15 September 1950

The 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines landed on and secured Wolmi-do Island in Inchon Harbor prior to the main landing. The 1st MarDiv, commanded by Major General Oliver P. Smith landed at Inchon and began the Inchon-Seoul Campaign.

16 September 1814

A detachment of Marines under Major Daniel Carmick from the Naval Station at New Orleans, together with an Army detachment, destroyed a pirate stronghold at Barataria, on the Island of Grande Terre, near New Orleans.

18 September 1990

A new 40-acre training facility for **Military Operations in Urban Terrain** (MOUT) was dedicated at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, by **General Alfred M. Gray**, Commandant of the Marine Corps.

28 September 1900,

Marines withdrew from Peking after the Battle of Peking – the end of the Boxer Rebellion


