


The **Marines Helping Hero's Golf Tournament** was an outstanding success. I am proud of everyone involved for making the tournament such a huge success.

Proposed Changes to the National Bylaws and Administrative Procedures

As per the National Judge Advocate Warren Griffin and the National Chief Operating Officer Bob Borka, this e-mail is to inform you that the new "re-write" of the National Bylaws and the new "rewrite" of the National Administrative Procedures are now on the National Website as per direction of the National Bylaws, Article Eight, Section 800.

These two newly rewritten documents and all proposed National Bylaws and Administrative Procedures changes were placed on the National Website prior to 1 May 2018 as required.

Please review the re-write of the new National Bylaws, the re-write of the new National Administrative Procedures, and all proposed changes to these two documents at your convenience.

These proposed changes may be downloaded to your computers, tablet, smart phones, and/or any other device that you may have. If you plan to attend the National Convention in August 2018 in Buffalo, NY, please either print copies for your use and/or use your computer, tablet, or smart phone to view these documents at the National Conventions.

The proposed changes will be shown on the overhead projector but printed copies will not be handed out.

There are 31 separate proposed changes. The first two listed are the "NATIONAL BYLAWS RE-WRITE FINAL" and the "NATIONAL ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES REWRITE FINAL." All other proposed National Bylaws and Administrative Procedures changes follows.

Corps History

1 June 1918

"Retreat Hell! We just got here," said the 5th Marine Regiment in France.

5 June 1944

Lieutenant General H. M. (Howlin' Mad) Smith is designated the first FMF Pac Commander.

6 June 1918

Marines advance into Belleau Wood against German machine guns.

8 June 1995

Team of 40 Marines rescues downed USAF pi-lot, Captain Scott O'Grady, who had been shot down over Bosnia-Herzegovina six days earlier.

12 June 1961

President John F. Kennedy signs a presidential proclamation calling for the American flag to be flown at the Marine Corps War Memorial in Ar-lington, Virginia, "at all times... day and night."

18 June 1945

Major General Roy S. Geiger, USMC, assumes command of the 10th Army during the battle for Okinawa after Army Lieutenant General Simon Buckner's killed.

21 June 1945

The battle for Okinawa ends with the raising of the American flag by Lieutenant General Roy S. Geiger, USMC.

22 June 1954

President Eisenhower authorizes the use of the first official Marine Corps Seal.

25 June 1950

Korean War begins when North Korean forces invade South Korea.

25 June 1971

Last Marine ground troops depart Vietnam.

Report on Veteran Suicides

VA released its annual report on veteran suicides on Monday. This data, which includes the number of suicides from 2005-2015, also includes the number of suicides from DOD. In 2016, VA released data that found the average number of veterans who die by suicide each day to be 20. The average daily toll remains at 20 per day, but also includes the numbers of those who died by suicide while on active duty, as well as in the Guard or Reserve. The average number of those currently serving is reported to be 3.8 suicide deaths per day. The data shows that the number of veterans who are actively enrolled in VA is six veterans per day. The remaining 10 per day either have not used VA within a year, are not enrolled in VA or were still serving in uniform. Women veterans and older male veterans who never deployed are still at the highest risk for death by suicide.

In the Washington Post!

Institution and historical reporter Michael Ruane recently visited the National Museum of the Marine Corps to learn about the Battle of Belleau Wood. Read his article below...

The Battle of Belleau Wood was brutal, deadly and forgotten. But it forged a new Marine Corps By Michael Ruane, *The Washington Post*

Col. Albertus W. Catlin stood on a rise in the ground with his field glasses and watched his Marines advance through the waist-high wheat toward the woods 400 yards away.

He was closer to the fighting than he should have been and would soon pay the price. But he was a big, cigar-smoking Marine who had been serving aboard the USS Maine when it blew up in Havana harbor in 1898, and he had a Medal of Honor from the fighting at Vera Cruz in 1914.

This was June 6, 1918, though, and as his men walked toward the old French hunting preserve of Belleau Wood, they were about to launch a bloody new era in the history of the Corps.

This June marks the 100th anniversary of the largely forgotten World War I Battle of Belleau Wood in northern France. Marines are remembering the landmark, three-week fight with events at home and overseas.

The National Museum of the Marine Corps, in Triangle, Va., is unveiling an exhibit of World War I art on June 6.

In April, French President Emmanuel Macron gave the White House an oak sapling from Belleau Wood, where, he said, "the blood [of Americans] was spilled to defend France." The battle was a modest affair compared with the titanic World War I struggles that went on for months. But, fought across open fields and in the dark, overgrown woods, it seemed especially grim, with hand-to-hand fighting, fixed bayonets and poison gas attacks







The Corps took delivery of its first CH-53 King Stallion on May 16, 2018 at the New River Air Station in Jacksonville, North Carolina. (Marine Corps)

The CH-53K is one of the most powerful helicopters across the Defense Department and is capable of lifting nearly three times the weight of its predecessor, the CH-53E.

But the King Stallion isn't slated to be operational until sometime in 2019. The helicopter delivered by Sikorsky has further testing to undergo with the Corps.
