

## GOVERNOR HOGAN COMMEMORATES MARCH 30 AS WELCOME HOME VIETNAM VETERANS DAY IN MARYLAND



ANNAPOLIS, MD—Governor Larry Hogan today commemorated March 30 as "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day," which coincides with a call by the United States Vietnam War Commemoration to join in thanking and honoring Vietnam veterans and their families for their service and sacrifice.

"Our administration is eternally grateful for the men and women who bravely served this country, and we are proud to give our veterans this well-deserved recognition," said Governor Hogan. "Our citizens enjoy freedom because of the many sacrifices of our military veterans, so today, I ask all Marylanders to join together in welcoming

home those who selflessly served."

On March 30, 2015, Governor Hogan signed the "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day" bill into law with unanimous support from the Maryland General Assembly. More than 2.7 million Americans served in the Vietnam War with nearly 9 million serving during the Vietnam era.



## INFLATION AND PANDEMIC DRIVE PROPOSED VA BUDGET TO MORE THAN \$300 BILLION [Stars & Stripes]

WASHINGTON — A White House proposal released Monday would push the Department of Veterans Affairs budget to more than \$300 billion for the first time, with much of the increase going toward veterans' medical care.

Overall, the proposal amounts to a 10.5% increase over the VA's enacted budget for 2022. The White House is requesting about 20% more for medical care, and it cited health care inflation, as well as the lasting effects of the coronavirus pandemic, as major reasons for the boost.

## On This Day

#### 1 April 1945

The Battle of Okinawa (April 1, 1945-June 22, 1945) was the last major battle of World War II, and one of the bloodiest. On April 1, 1945—Easter Sunday—the Navy's Fifth Fleet and more than 180,000 U.S. Army and U.S. Marine Corps troops descended on the Pacific island of Okinawa for a final push towards Japan.

#### 10 April 1959

**Lieutenant Colonel John H. Glenn, Jr.** was named as one of the original seven Project Mercury astronauts selected for space training.

#### 17 April 1915

Medal of Honor recipient Joseph "Joe" Foss, was born in Sioux Falls, South Dakota.

In 1940, Foss joined the Marine Corps as a pilot, and went on to become a leading American "ace" during World War II. During his time in the Corps, Foss won 26 aerial victories and received numerous awards, including the **Distinguished** 

Flying Cross and the Medal of Honor for his actions over Guadalcanal in the Solomon Islands where he recorded 23 confirmed (and numerous other probable) kills in just over a month between October and November of 1942.

Following his time in the military, Foss had a number of jobs, including serving as the 20th Governor of South Dakota, the Commissioner of the American Football League, and the President of the National Rifle Association. He died in Arizona in 2003 at the age of 87.

#### 25 April 1897

Medal of Honor recipient **Merritt "Red Mike" Edson** was born in Chester, Vermont.

When World War II broke out, Edson was assigned as the Commanding officer of the Marine Raiders.

Edson retired from the Marine Corps in 1947, after being promoted to the rank of Major General. Following his time in the Corps, Edson became the first Commissioner of the Vermont State Police before later serving as the Executive Director of the National Rifle Association. In addition to the Medal of Honor, Edson also earned two Navy Crosses, the Silver Star, and two Legions of Merit during his time in the Corps.

#### 27 April 1805

To the shores of Tripoli. First Lieutenant Presley O'Bannon and seven other Marines, along with Greek and Arab forces, who were under the command of American Consul William Eaton raised the American flag over the fortress at Derne, a pirate stronghold in Tripoli. This was the first time the American flag had been raised over a conquered fortress in the Old World. Two Marines were killed and another was injured in the assault on the city.

The measure must now go to the Senate, where it faces an uncertain future. Some senators prefer an incremental approach to expanding health care and benefits, rather than one comprehensive bill.

"We passed the most comprehensive legislation to date to treat toxic exposure as a cost of war and ensure that all toxic-exposed veterans can access the care and benefits they've earned," said Rep. Mark Takano, D-Calif., the chairman of the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs. "This fight is not over, but I will not rest until our veterans have a guarantee in statute that their government will take care of them when they come home — no matter the cost."

The bill would increase spending by about \$208 billion during the next decade because of the expanded eligibility for disability compensation, according to the latest estimates from the Congression.

sional Budget Office. The office estimated the bill would cost an additional \$110 billion in the following 10 years for the expansion of health care.

Throughout the 1990s and the post-9/11 wars, the military used open-air pits to burn garbage, jet fuel, paint, medical waste, plastics and other materials. Veterans diagnosed with cancer, respiratory issues and lung disease at young ages have blamed exposure to the toxic fumes. They have sought VA benefits and health care, but the department contended for years that there wasn't sufficient evidence to support their claims.

The PACT Act would add 23 of those cancers and respiratory illnesses to the list of conditions that would qualify veterans for VA benefits and health care.

The bill also addresses other types of toxic exposure. The bill calls for presumptive benefits for Vietnam War veterans who have developed hypertension because of exposure to chemical herbicides, as well as veterans who served in Thailand, Laos and Cambodia and were potentially exposed to herbicides. It also includes veterans who participated in toxic cleanup activities in Enewetak Atoll or Palomares, Spain.

Rep. Mike Bost of Illinois, the ranking Republican on the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs, criticized Democrats for approving the bill and argued Thursday in favor of the Senate's approach to the issue.




