CHAPLAIN

2021 was an event filled year, for our country and for our detachment. We are all familiar with the events that captured national headlines. Unfortunately, most of those headlines do not bode well for the future of our country. This tells us that as Americans and as Marines we must stay engaged with our local and national leaders to ensure that everything that can be done is being done to preserve our great country. While it is true that, as a nation we are not perfect, America still provides the most hope and the best opportunities for people of every race, religion, and ethnicity. Our country is the only country in history to ever attempt to fulfill the promise that, we are all created equal. The beginning of a new year is the time for each of us to rededicate ourselves to seeing to it that America remains the land of the free and the home of the brave.

Detachment 1049 had another successful year. Funds raised by our golf tournament and our 5k run provided much needed financial support to the America's and Semper Fi Fund, TreatNow, and our special needs Boy Scout Troop.

Of special note: We received a letter from a Marine veteran of the war in Afghanistan. He was suffering from a Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) and Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). Funds raised by our golf tournament and our 5K run paid for his hyperbaric oxygen (HBOT) treatments. Excerpts from his letter are as follows:

"In 2019, I was on the verge of becoming another suicide statistic. My faith was strong, but my body was not, and I was tired of fighting. Tired of the sleeplessness, the chronic pain but perhaps most terrifying, the hopelessness of ever truly healing"....... "After the first HBOT treatment the migraines were gone. Along with that came additional relief in several other areas as well, greatly contributing to some critical improvements for me and most of all, giving me hope again"..... "My family and I are eternally grateful for the effort and sacrifices so many are making to make HBOT available to our servicemembers and for funding the way to success"......"Hope is literally the difference between life and death in my world. Thank you for giving me hope".

The letter is signed, Dan M. USMC, retired.

This letter tells us that we are making a significant difference in the lives of our fellow veterans and that we should redouble our efforts in 2022.

16 January 1991

Operation Desert Shield became **Operation Desert Storm** as allied coalition forces launched an all-out attack air campaign against targets in Iraq and occupied Kuwait in an effort to liberate Kuwait and enforce the resolutions of the United Nations Security Council.

20 January 1968

The second battle for **Khe Sanh** began outside the village of the same name in the Quang Tri Province, Vietnam, 14 miles south of the DMZ and six miles east of the Laotian border, when the People's Army of North Vietnam (PAVN) launched a massive artillery bombardment on the U.S. Marine garrison. For the next 77 days, until April 6, the Marines and their South Vietnamese allies, the Army of the Republic of Vietnam (ARVN), fought off the siege in what was the longest, and one of the bloodiest, battles in the war.

22 January 1969

Operation Dewey Canyon, arguably the most successful high-mobility regimental-size action of the Vietnam War, began in the A Shau/Da Krong Valleys when the 9th Marines, commanded by Colonel Robert H. Barrow, and supporting artillery were lifted from Quang Tri. By mid-March, the enemy's base area had been cleared out, 1617 enemy combatants had been killed, and more than 500 tons of weapons and ammunition were recovered. Barrow later went on to become the 27th Commandant of the Marine Corps.



29 January 1991

The first serious ground-combat of **Operation Desert Storm** broke out when Iraqi troops mounted an attack into Saudi Arabia along a 40-mile front. Iraqi units centered their efforts on Khafji, a port city six miles south of the border. Saudi and Quatari troops, supported by artillery from the 1st Marine Division, attack helicopters, and other allied coalition aircraft, recaptured the town two days later.



The Philippine Marine Corps is organized into four maneuver brigades, a Combat Service and Support Brigade (CSSB), the Coastal Defense Regiment (CDR) and independent units such as the Marine Special Operations Group (MARSOG) and the Marine Security and Escort Group (MSEG). The four maneuver brigades provide administrative and logistical support to the units assigned to them, while the CSSB acts as a training and administrative command for the Field Artillery (FABN) and Assault Armor (AABN) battalions.
