Women Veterans/Inclusion Program



The MDVA Women Veterans/Inclusion Program collaborates with the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, state and local governments, and community organizations to coordinate events to raise awareness of the needs of Maryland's women, minority, and underserved veteran populations. In 2022, a statewide advisory group will convene to identify resources to support and advocate on behalf of this group of veterans. The program manager will be holding focus groups and a round table discussion in advance of establishing this advisory group. They also participate

in workgroups and serve as a subject matter expert regarding the needs of underserved

veterans.

COMING THIS SUMMER



VA Adds New Presumptive Conditions:



VA has added nine rare respiratory cancers to the list of presumptive conditions for particulate matter exposure from service in Southwest Asia. These conditions were proposed in March and have now been added to VA's regulations through an interim final rule. The VFW sees this as a step in the right direction to help veterans exposed to toxins but remains committed to passing the comprehensive toxic exposure legislation, *Honoring our PACT Act*, to codify VA's presumptive process.

Mental Health Awareness:

To spotlight mental health in May, VA encourages veterans to <u>make the connection</u>. Learn how veterans with issues like your own have worked through them to achieve a better quality of life or find other <u>mental health resources</u>. On This Day

2 May 1946

Marines Put Down Prison Riot Marines from the Treasure Island Marine Barracks aided in suppressing a three-day prison riot at Alcatraz Federal Penitentiary in San Francisco Bay. The Marines were under the command of Warrant Officer Charles L. Buckner, a veteran of the Bougainville and Guam campaigns in World War II, and did not suffer a single casualty.

10 May 1945

Marines March Toward Naha, Okinawa The 22nd Marines, 6th Marine Division, executed a pre-dawn attack across the Asa River Estuary and captured a bridgehead that allowed them to continue their attack toward Naha, the capital of Okinawa.

15 May 1862

John Mackie Earns First Marine Medal of Honor Corporal John F. Mackie became the first Marine to earn the Medal of Honor for his Service on the USS Galena during actions against Confederate shore batteries at Drewry's Bluff, near Richmond, Virginia.

22 May 1912

Marine Aviation Begins First Lieutenant **Alfred A. Cunningham** became the first Marine officer to be assigned to "duty in connection with aviation" by Major General Commandant William P. Biddle after reporting for aviation training at the Naval Aviation Camp at **Annapolis, Maryland**. This marked the official beginning of the Marine aviation program.

23 May 1988

V-22 Osprey Makes Debut The V-22 Osprey, the world's first production tilt-rotor aircraft, made its debut at Bell Helicopter Textron's Arlington, Texas, facility. More than 1,000 representatives from the military, the aviation industry, and the media gathered to hear various speakers, including then-Commandant of the Marine Corps, General Alfred Gray, praise the versatility of the aircraft.

26 May 1969

Operation Pipestone Canyon began when the 1st Battalion, 26th Marines and 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines began sweeps in the "Dodge City"/Go Noi areas southwest of Da Nang, Vietnam. 610 enemy troops, as well as 34 Marines, were killed during the operation, which ended approximately one month later, in late June.

'We Should Have Been There': Marine General Laments the State of the Amphib Navy


A FAILURE TO DEPLOY IN FEBRUARY ILLUSTRATES THE LOW READINESS OF THE NATION'S AMPHIBIOUS WARSHIPS, A MARINE THREE-STAR TELLS DEFENSE ONE.

Maintenance problems with three amphibious warships kept a Marine Expeditionary Unit from answering urgent orders to Europe earlier this year, and a deputy commandant fears it could happen again.

On Feb. 15, the Joint Staff sent prepare-to-deploy orders to the 22nd Marine Expeditionary Unit at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, and to its associated Naval amphibious ready group. Their purpose: "provide bridging solutions" to Gen. Tod Wolters, the commander of U.S. European Command and NATO's Supreme Allied Commander Europe, according to Lt. Gen. Karsten Heckl, the commanding general of Marine Corps Combat Development Command and deputy commandant for Combat Development and Integration.

The 22nd MEU was already prepared to go. However, the maintenance status of the three warships of the Kearsarge Amphibious Ready Group was "so bad" they were not prepared to leave then or after the invasion, Heckl told *Defense One* on Thursday. They were even late to meet their original deployment date.

"When you get within X number of days of your deployment date, you're placed basically on a [prepare-to-deploy order] and the Kearsarge ARG failed that as well. Which is basically a violation of orders from my perspective as a Marine, right? If the joint order tells you to be ready on X day, then you're to be ready on X day, and they were not."
