From Around the Corps

F-35B still undergoing repairs at Japanese airport weeks after precautionary landing

A Marine Corps F-35B Lightning II that made a precautionary landing at a Japanese airport more than three weeks ago is still undergoing maintenance, the service said Tuesday. The stealth jet, assigned to Marine Fighter Attack Squadron 121 at Marine Corps



Air Station Iwakuni, landed at Kochi Airport on the afternoon of March 25 after the pilot received a warning indication during a routine training flight, 1st Marine Aircraft Wing spokesman Maj. Joseph Butterfield said at the time. As of Tuesday morning, the jet remained parked at the airport in Kochi prefecture, where it is undergoing parts replacement and maintenance, Butterfield told Stars and Stripes by email that day. No timeline has been set for its return to MCAS Iwakuni, said Butterfield, who declined to provide further details, citing security concerns. "The aircraft's onboard systems worked as designed and alerted the pilot to a potential issue, and the pilot responded as trained to ensure safe flight operations," he wrote. "We will continue thorough inspections of the aircraft to ensure its safe return to home station."

Suicide prevention: Selfcheck assessment

Confidential questionnaire can help you find out if stress and depression are affecting you

Checking in with yourself can save your life.

For me, the gym is more than a place for exercise. It's where I tune in to my body and mind. As I get older, my joints and muscles have plenty to say, and I've learned to listen.

But beyond the occasional aches and pains, the gym is my personal check-in point. It's where I take stock of life, sort through challenges and find clarity when stress starts piling up. I admit that it sometimes can be a struggle.

Veterans tend to prioritize others' needs. But if you're at the point where it's second nature to just keep pushing through negative issues, you could end up overwhelmed. You could even face a crisis.

It's always a good idea to check in with yourself, and we want you to know that there's a tool available for you.

What is VA's self-check assessment?

VA and the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention teamed up to create the <u>Veterans Self-Check Assessment</u>, a free, confidential tool to help you find out if stress and depression are affecting you and what you can do about it.

The assessment includes a series of questions that takes about 10 minutes to complete. It's designed specifically for Veterans, active-duty military service members and members of the National Guard and Reserve, as well as their family members.

ROT THE PERSON NAMED IN TH

Lieutenant Colonel John H. Glenn Selected for Space Training

On April 10, 1959, Lieutenant Colonel John H. Glenn, Jr. was named as one of the original seven Project Mercury astronauts selected for space training. All seven astronauts were volunteers and were selected by NASA out of a pool of 110 candidates, all of whom were leading military test pilots. Just under three years later, in February of 1962, Glenn became the first American to orbit the Earth.

Ine Foss Born

On April 17, 1915, future Medal of Honor recipient Joseph "Joe" Foss, was born in Sioux Falls, South Dakota.

In 1940, Foss joined the Marine Corps as a pilot, and went on to become a leading American "ace" during World War II. During his time in the Corps, Foss won 26 aerial victories and received numerous awards, including the Distinguished Flying Cross and the Medal of Honor for his actions over Guadalcanal in the Solomon Islands where he recorded 23 confirmed (and numerous other probable) kills in just over a month between October and November of 1942.

Following his time in the military, Foss had a number of jobs, including serving as the 20th Governor of South Dakota, the Commissioner of the American Football League, and the President of the National Rifle Association. He died in Arizona in 2003 at the age of 87.

Merritt "Red Mike" Edson Born

On April 25, 1897, future Medal of Honor recipient Merritt "Red Mike" Edson was born in Chester, Vermont.

In October 1917, Edson received his commission as a Second Lieutenant in the Marine Corps, and served in France and Germany during World War I. Following the war, Edson held several positions before going to flight school in 1922. After graduating flight school and being designated a Naval Aviator, he performed several assignments in Central America and China.

When World War II broke out, Edson was assigned as the Commanding officer of the Marine Raiders. While commanding Marine Raiders on Guadalcanal, Edson earned the Medal of Honor for the defense of Lunga Ridge on September 13-14, 1942. During the battle, Edson's Raider Battalion, along with two companies of the 1st Parachute Battalion, were assigned to defend Lunga Ridge, a short distance south of Henderson Field in what was supposed to be a relatively uneventful mission.








Four Recruits Graduate
