A DIGNIFIED FAREWELL: WHY HOSPICE IS A MINISTRY OF HOPE

"For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain." Philippians 1:21

November is Hospice Awareness Month. Let's be honest, talking about the end of life isn't exactly a barrel of laughs. But here's where the beautiful, often unsung ministry of Hospice steps in, flipping the script from a stark finale to a tender, deeply human last chapter.

Think of it this way: for most of our lives, we're rushing around, ticking off to-do lists. But a Christian approach to a "dignified death" isn't about maintaining maximum control or putting on a brave face to the bitter end. It's about remembering a fundamental truth: our dignity isn't earned by our hustle; it's a gift from God, woven into the fabric of our being.

Hospice care recognizes that our value doesn't disappear when our strength does. Instead, it creates a loving, supportive space where that intrinsic worth can truly shine. It's the team that says, "We may not be able to add more days to your life, but we sure can add more life to your days!" They manage pain, yes, but they also bring peace, permission to talk (or not talk), and great pillow fluffing.

The true dignity of dying well, from a faith perspective, is less about how we leave and more about who we are as we approach the threshold—a beloved child of God, fearlessly heading home. It's a chance to offer a final, beautiful witness to the peace that passes all understanding. I have interacted with many Hospice teams during my time in the ministry, and every one of them has been outstanding. Join me in offering the following prayer:

Heavenly Father, we lift up all those in the hospice ministry and those in their care.

For the patients, grant a comforting peace that stills all fear and gentle release from all suffering. Remind them, in their final days, of your constant presence and the hope of their eternal home.

For the Hospice workers, grant them strength for every shift, wisdom for every conversation, and the true joy of being your hands and feet. Let their weariness be refreshed and their compassion never run dry. In the name of Jesus, we pray. Amen.



On Sunday, November 9th,





the permanent endowment fund, or another choice. Talk to treasurer Tami Chamberlain or Pastor Laura for more information or ideas.




More Than a Dress: Angel Shop Homecoming Success

Franklin High School Drama Club: "The Old Man and The Old Moon"



The show is suitable for all ages, and tickets are available now at fhsdrama.booktix.com; tickets will also be available at the door.

The story follows an old man whose job is to fill the leaking moon with light each night. When his wife disappears, drawn away by a haunting melody from their past, he must choose between duty and love. His pursuit takes him through apocalyptic storms, naval battles, and encounters with both ghosts and leviathans of the deep—ultimately exploring the timeless challenge of embracing change.

- * Angel Shop: The Angel Shop, which provides formal wear for local students, reported a successful Homecoming season! An amazing 100 people were served with attire for their dances. The shop still has approximately 400 dresses remaining for future events.
- * Weekly Support for Gerke Elementary: The mission to provide weekly nourishment to local students is going strong! The team is currently assembling 83 snack packs per week for the first-grade children at Gerke Elementary. The National Honor Society from the high school will assist with filling packs one week a month, and the congregation is invited to help during designated Fellowship Sundays.
- * Trunk or Treat Success: The team participated in this year's Trunk or Treat in downtown Franklin! Participants Jenny, Sally and Gib, Mike and Carol, Karen and Andy, and Mike and Linda helped spread cheer. Together, they distributed candy and other items to over 700 children!

Ongoing and Future Ministry

- * **Tutoring** began on September 18th and will run until November 20th. It will then restart again in January to continue providing academic assistance.
- * Christmas Gift Boxes for college students will continue this year. The team will be compiling a list of students soon.
- * Collections for the community are in full swing! We are asking for donations of paper products (toilet paper, paper towels, tissues) for the Food Pantry throughout October, November, and December. We also continue to collect personal hygiene products for students at Franklin High School and Jr. High.
- * Teacher Appreciation is being planned for the Spring, likely in May.

Gratitude in Every Situation by: Joseph Yoo

My wife and I struggled with infertility. During the real diffi-

cult stretches, it did-

n't help that we were part of a Korean church that consistently asked us about when we were having kids. Someone asked my wife if she was pregnant and when my wife said, "No" the lady then asked, "Why are you gaining weight?" (We Koreans tend to be very blunt.)

It got even more difficult when our friends began announcing great news of impending bundles of joy. (It got annoying when friends were making their 4th pregnancy announcement...)

For me, it was the worst when my former youth kids were now married and sharing the news that they were pregnant.

How can I be grateful?

One year, a former youth called my wife to share her great news that she was pregnant. After their conversation, my wife told me to call them and congratulate them myself.

I couldn't. I *just* couldn't. I was feeling so many emotions. Anger. Frustration. Jealously. And it was never really aimed at my former youth student. I was blaming God for all the emotions that were coursing through my body.

The worst part was that coming Sunday. I was preaching on 1 Thessalonians 5:18 which reads,

"Give thanks in every situation because this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

I remember praying, "How the hell do you expect me to preach on *that* after this?"

But my mind kept circling back to the phrase "give thanks in every situation." That "every" was (is) a

sticking point with me. I would be able to get behind *some* situations... or even *most* situations... but *every* situation?

But here's what I've learned since that incident: The act of choosing is a spiritual act.

We can choose how we perceive things; we can choose the kind of world we create and live in. We choose how we react.

We can choose to focus on what we're blessed with or we can choose to lament on what we don't have.

The point is, we get to choose. It's just gratitude isn't often the go-to emotion we choose. We have the choice of how much power we give to our emotions and our responses. We tend to give more power and a bit more of a starring role to things like fear, grief, frustration, anger, regret, anxiousness, jealousy.

Choosing gratitude

So we have to be intentional in choosing gratitude. We have to practice giving thanks. And if we keep building the muscle of gratitude, we find the strength to give thanks in every situation, like Paul said (and did).

I spend way too much time focusing on what I don't have, lamenting on what's not right and pointing out what's wrong.

What we often may not realize is we will *always* find what we are looking for. We are in charge of the kind of world we create by the choices we make.

Gratitude helps me reframe the world. Being thankful opens my heart; my eyes; my soul to see beauty in this world. Practicing gratitude helps me discover the abundance of God. Gratitude turns what I have into enough. It reveals what I have more than what I need and surprisingly, what I have is enough.

That gives me strength to actually be thankful in *every* situation.

Paul's not saying be thankful <u>for</u> every situation. He's not asking us to be thankful that our life is a mess and that we keep hitting wall after wall, swimming through pain after pain. He's not asking us to be some crazy masochist thanking God for this unbearable pain that has forced its way into life.

But we find strength in giving gratitude and that strength might lead us to ask, "How will God use this situation?" even in the most difficult of situations.

The more we practice gratitude, the easier it will be to be thankful in every situation. We also create an environment — a world— that, not only makes it easier for others to be grateful, but encourages them to see the blessings around all of us.

In every situation

Back to the opening story, I eventually got over myself and called my former youth student and congratulated her and her husband. I was genuinely happy for them. As for us, we eventually adopted our foster son, who's on the autism spectrum. He's in a wonderful stage at his life (which I hope never ends) where he thanks people for everything and anything: "Thank you, Daddy, for tak-

ing me to the bathroom at Bucee's." (Note: Bucee's is a huge gas station that's like an attraction more than a pit stop). He is also the most joy-filled human being I know. I believe those two things go together As Karl Barth said: "Joy is the simplest form of gratitude."

May we choose gratitude not just during the season of Thanksgiving — but in every situation. May we choose to count our blessings more and more rather than lament on what we lack.

"If you concentrate on finding whatever is good in every situation, you will discover that your life will suddenly be filled with gratitude, a feeling that nurtures the soul." — Rabbi Harold Kushner
