




God's Plan for 2022

"For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you. When you search for me, you will find me; if you seek me with all your heart." Jeremiah 29:11-13





Every day we have choices to make about how we fill our days. Some of those decisions don't have much room for negotiation. The doctor's appointment is very important. The work obligation is firm. The family need is strong. We fill those squares in with fair certainty that we need to honor those commitments.

But some of our calendar has wiggle room. The world of finance talks about "discretionary income," but we also have "discretionary time" at our disposal. Some folks more than others, but choices are there to make never-the-less. So how do we decide what to calendar?

Please understand that I'm not a scheduled person by nature (just ask Lee - because he is and I'm oftentimes a frustration to him.) But I do think that we need to be intentional about how we spend our time. My emphasis here is on the word "spend," because once a day is gone we do not get it back.

There are four Legs of Health that we need to attend to, and we need to make sure that our used time includes deposits into each category:

Spiritual: Refers to discovering Godly purpose and meaning. Only by tuning in to God's word, prayer, worship, and fellowship will we connect with ultimate purpose. Our time can be eaten up by trivial things, but without engaging in divine purpose, life can seem fruitless.

Emotional: Especially in this atmosphere of ongoing COVID and national unrest, we need to be taking care of our emotional health. That means engaging with people and places that offer positive energy into our emotional bank account. It may mean turning off the news or distancing ourselves from toxicity. It will also mean scheduling to give ourselves away for the benefit of others. There is little that is as emotionally charging as helping someone else.

Mental: Here I'm referring to our imagination and creativity, which bring nourishment to our souls. God is a Creator, and we are made in God's image. Ruts of any kind eventually drain us. Try something new, set new goals, set the bar higher with an established hobby. "All work and no play make Laura a dull girl," as Grandma would say.

Physical: We can get lazy. To keep fit, it's important to pay attention to diet and exercise, to sleep habits and addiction tendencies. We can tend to blame God for our diseases without admitting that we've contributed to them with our lifestyles.

As I fill my calendar, there are some things that I need to intentionally schedule and some things I need to decline. God help all of us to make wise choices.

Revitalization Grant

In 2021, the West Ohio Conference awarded Franklin First a \$20,000 grant to revitalize our Education Wing. We are so grateful for their support. The work on that grant is now complete. There is WIFI accessibility and new technology for use downstairs and in the classrooms. The third floor areas have been completely refurbished and updated with child-friendly décor. The stairways have new flooring. Updated lighting, along with cleaning and painting have brought a new brightness. Our second floor restroom is remodeled, and we have a new welcome center right outside the nursery where adults can check their kids into children's ministry events.

Thank you to everyone who worked so tirelessly to bring this project to fruition. We logged more than \$10,000 of in-kind labor that enabled the scope of the project to expand for even better use of our grant money. A special thanks to Mike Runyan who chaired the initiative and kept us on-track.

Snack Pack Ministry

Many of our school children in Franklin rely on school meals for daily nutrition. On the weekends when these meals are not available, there are children who could go hungry. Franklin First packs shelf stable food stuffs to send home each weekend during the school year to those kids at Anthony Wayne Elementary whom the school has

identified as "at risk." In 2021, more than 3600 snack packs were provided. We are grateful for the Ohio River Valley UMC grant that underwrites part of the expenses for these items.



Free Medical Clinic

As we have moved into colder weather, the number of patients utilizing Franklin First's Free Clinic has increased. Dr. Chamberlain and his volunteer staff treat a wide range of medical needs, from diabetes-related conditions, to infections, to blood pressure issues...the scope of treatment is different each time the clinic operates. Pastor Laura offers prayer for any client that wishes, and we also provide referrals to other services as needed.


content — let me know if you have an idea.

New Year, New Opportunities

Message from Bishop Palmer

Dear friends in Christ Jesus:

Welcome to 2022. An all-new year, all new opportunities has unfolded. What is true about the turn of the year is quite frankly true about the gift of every new day. The reality that each year and each day places before us a fresh opportunity to become more fully who God intends for us to be does not at all signify that we are without challenges. It makes me ponder whether or not our challenges are in fact our opportunities. How we lean into our challenges can make all the difference in the quality of our lives.

Speaking of challenge our continued wrestling with the ominous presence of COVID-19 and its variants has become so defining of our lives. The last two years have called forth the meaning of perseverance in ways that we may not have known before. All of us know what it means to persevere through personal challenge or difficulty. This long season of living with multiple pandemics have called and will continue to call forth our capacity to learn to persevere together. It is ultimately in the together that the quality of our perseverance is measured.

Speaking of together, we have and will continue to be challenged on finding common ground in church and society. Consider just the stresses and tensions we live with, multiple times a day, about best practices related to COVID like vaccines and masking to name a few. We are still falling short of sufficient agreement to keep from tearing ourselves apart. Or consider the fractures and fissures in our civic life, long suspected but confirmed by the violent insurrection on January 6 at the Nation's Capitol. It occurring on the Epiphany of Our Lord is not lost on me. On the liturgical date -Epiphany- when large parts of the Christian communion were paying close attention to the revealing of our God in Jesus of Nazareth, we were given another revelation about the depth of the brokenness of our common life. There is Epiphany and there are epiphanies all along the way. They are not the same. They are not equal. The question is when light shines on a reality how we will respond?

And speaking of response, I close inviting you to join me in a grateful and joyful remembrance of God's servant, Desmond Mpilo Tutu, baptized a Methodist, confirmed an Anglican. He was teacher, friend, husband, father, grandfather, prophet, priest, pastor and bishop. Who in the face of the challenge and cruelty of Apartheid resisted its injustice but never the relationships needed to build a new society. He valued truthful speech and confrontation but eschewed violence. He actually lived as if broken humanity could be redeemed and reconciled. He embodied that "there is no future without forgiveness." This is the work all of us who know, love and call the name of Jesus, are called to do in our time and place. Let's have at it without reserve.

Pathways Program Needs Volunteers In Dayton

In October of 2021, we celebrated with the City of Dayton



the conclusion of the individual homeowner recovery process, following the 2019 Memorial Day tornadoes. Yet the recovery process has been ongoing for survivors whose rental units were destroyed in that same

storm. Now, West Ohio work teams and congregations have the opportunity to serve these neighbors. The Pathways to Home Ownership Project assists families displaced from tornado-damaged rental housing in becoming first-time homeowners.

From January 9 to April 2, 2022, the disaster ministry of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) will be hosting volunteers to finish the interiors of homes as part of this project. Below are more details on how you can help:

TEAMS

- 4-10 people
- 14 years of age or older (must have 1 adult for every 4 volunteers under 18)

WORK and SKILLS

- Teams should commit to a minimum of 3 days of work; most teams work Monday-Friday
- All skill levels are welcome! While some "handyperson" knowledge is helpful, the only necessity is a willingness to work and learn
- Volunteers will be doing a variety of interior construction tasks (installing flooring, painting, hanging doors, etc.)
- Tools will be provided

HOUSING

- A housing site is available at a local church, if needed
- Cost of housing is \$50/person/week to cover building use and utilities

COVID

To mitigate the risks of COVID-19 for our volunteers and the communities we serve, all volunteers who are eligible to receive the vaccine must do so before serving.

There will be site-specific COVID-19 protocols, subject to change according to local health guidelines.

ERT Trainings To Prep Teams for Tornado Clean-Up

Two Early Response Team trainings will be held in the first two months of 2022 to prepare individuals to respond to the disasters in Kentucky and around the U.S.

The first training will be held online via Zoom on January 14-15, and the second will be held in-person at Aley UMC in Beavercreek on February 12. Both trainings will be taught by UMCOR-certified West Ohio ERT trainers and will include the 8-hour Basic ERT class to train new responders in providing a caring Christian presence in the aftermath of a disaster. The February 12 training will also offer recertification for current ERT's.



- ERT Basic and Recertification Class (in-person) February 12, 8:00am-4:00pm at Aley UMC in Beavercreek. Cost is \$40 (Basic) or \$35 (recertification). All participants must be vaccinated against COVID-19 and wear masks during the training.
- A background check is required.


