### THE PARENT'S COMPASS:

### **GUIDING YOUR CHILD TOWARD SUCCESS**

As parents, we're our children's first teachers and lifelong cheerleaders. While education continues to evolve, our role in supporting their success stays the same. It's not about doing their homework—it's about creating the environment and encouragement they need to thrive. Here's how to be a steady compass on their academic journey:

### 1. Make Learning Part of Everyday Life

Spark curiosity at home by keeping books around, discussing current events, visiting museums, and asking questions. Show interest in what they're learning—not just their grades.

### 2. Build Routines That Support Success

Kids do best with structure. Set regular times for homework, sleep, and play. Help them stay organized with dedicated study spaces and tools to track assignments.

#### 3. Communicate Openly

Talk with your child about their school day—celebrate wins and listen to challenges. Stay connected with teachers and school staff to build a strong support system.

### 4. Promote Independence

Instead of solving problems for them, guide them to think critically and find solutions. Ask questions like, "What could you try next?" to build confidence and resilience.

#### 5. Celebrate Effort, Not Just Results

Focus on growth and persistence over perfection. Praise their hard work and willingness to try, even when the outcome isn't ideal. This helps develop a lifelong love of learning.

#### 6. Balance Academics with Well-being

Success starts with health. Make sure your child gets enough sleep, eats well, and has time to relax and play. A balanced life fuels better focus and learning.

Your support, presence, and belief in your child's potential are powerful tools. With your guidance, they'll not only succeed in school—they'll be prepared to navigate life with confidence.


### **Confirmation Class**

Training will last less than an hour and a meal will be served.






### **Back to Church Sunday**

Orders will be taken in advance online. Last year, 572 batches of noodles were made. Incredible!






### Fall Marketplace—Save the Date!

### **Children's Church Resumes**

Do you agree that teaching our children that faith in God is important? God calls each generation to instruct future generations on matters of faith. Kaylee Glossip is leading our Children's Education program, and she needs your help. Each Sunday, we need a lead teacher, a floating assistant, and a nursery volunteer. Prepared curriculum is available for you to use or you can use your own, and the kids are learning an age-appropriate survey of the Bible beginning with the Creation story in Genesis. They will

### **New Intermediate Church School Class**

High School Sophomore Kaylee Womack, assisted by her granddad Lee Saunders, is starting a new class during the worship hour for students in sixth grade and higher. The class will dismiss during worship following Children's Moment beginning September 14. The group will meet weekly except for Communion Sunday, the first week of each month (along with a few special programming Sundays), when the youth will stay in worship.

Kaylee will begin with lessons on Creation, and her curriculum will progress

through the book of Genesis as students learn about the Old Testament Patriarchs. There is no need to register for the class, but regular attendance is strongly encouraged. Students are welcome to bring friends.

# From Log Cabin to Legacy: Celebrating 200 Years of Faith in Franklin

The Genesis of our congregation occurred on Monday August 14, 1798, when the Methodist Episcopal circuit missionary Rev. John Kobler (1768-1843) preached to a few families in the log cabin of Captain Robert Ross. Over the next 25 plus years, the itinerant

visits by the circuit riders, local Methodist "classes" held informal worship services. However, in 1825 James E. Thirkield, John Rossman, Fletcher Emley, Stephen Wood, Thomas Emerson, and their wives created the Franklin Society of Methodists that grew steadily as others joined the society. Worship services continued being held in the members' homes and in the shared church building until a dedicated Methodist Episcopal church was built in 1832 that was replaced in 1836 with a larger brick church fronting Center (Main) Street, which is the site of the present Franklin First UMC building. Although the Franklin congregation didn't become a "Station" with the assignment of a full-time ordained minister until 1853, the Franklin Society of Methodists was very active including formation of an organized Sunday School starting in 1833. Finally, 2025 is also the bicentennial year for beginning construction of the Miami Erie canal, which played a major role in the growth and prosperity of Franklin during the rest of the 19th century.

# Aging Faithfully: Living with Purpose Every Day

"Growing older is easy—all you have to do is breathe. Aging faithfully is different," says Missy Buchanan, author, speaker, and advocate for older adults. "It re-



quires intentionality. It's saying, 'I'm going to continue to grow and live with purpose until my last breath.'"

A lifelong United Methodist, Buchanan has written eleven books published by **Upper Room Books**, offering encouragement for older adults and guidance for caregivers. Her work inspires readers to embrace aging as a journey of growth, not decline.

### **Practical Tips for Aging Faithfully**

Missy Buchanan encourages older adults to:

- •Try something new every day. Watch a documentary instead of cable news. Read a biography instead of a romance novel. "Be intentional about opening your mind to the things of the world," she advises.
- •Make the best of where you are. Ask yourself, "What can I do where I am now? How can I influence people?" Buchanan shares the story of a 99-year old man in a senior living facility known as the "high five guy." His simple gestures brought joy to others, reminding us that small acts can have great impact.
- •Embrace your evolving purpose. "What you are able to do may not look the same as it did once upon a time, but it's still so important," Buchanan says.
