Pastor Niki's Ponderings

A couple of years ago, at a routine doctor's appointment, I was brought up short by a very non-routine question: "In the past month, have you worried about where your next meal would come from?"

"What?" I asked. I think the nurse sensed my confusion. She explained that this was a new question they were asking in the office to all patients, no matter what they were there for or what their employment status. This was during the period of the COVID pandemic when there were still some struggling industries, people were unable to work, and supplemental income from unemployment was returning to pre-pandemic levels. Food insecurity was on the rise for many patients, and so the office wanted to make sure they had ways to connect people with community resources. While our family was not in need of those resources, I was grateful to see the list had many possible resources to turn to, including some local churches. And even now, a few years later, this question continues to be asked when I go to the doctor's office. For that, I give thanks.

It's awful that food insecurity is so common (especially in these last few months, as we have seen a greater need to be met by our food banks, pantries, etc.) Good nutrition, daily sustenance, it's essential to making sure we are able to live our lives, do physical tasks, focus on education and work, etc.

We also face an insecurity of another kind in our society, of a spiritual nature. There is an epidemic of loneliness, people who are struggling to find community and figure out where they belong in an increasingly divided world. We don't always think so much about that, particularly since it's not always a "life or death" physical/medical need, but the struggle with it is very real for those in the midst of it.

John Calvin, considered to be one of the forebears of the reformed theology that we as Presbyterians believe, held a high view of one of the ways in which we gather as a community of believers: around the table for the sacrament of communion. He believed we should gather and have communion at least once a week, for he argued that the Lord's Supper is the means by which God feeds the soul of the believer. For him, spiritual sustenance was just as important as physical sustenance. We see examples of this. even in scripture. In fact, many of the most significant stories from the life of Jesus Christ centered around a meal: the Last Supper, a meal with Zacchaeus, dining at Simon's, teaching while Martha prepared food. I mean, even as a newborn, Jesus himself was placed in a manger, a feeding trough for animals, in the town of Bethlehem (Hebrew for "house of bread.")

This Advent season, we'll talk more about what it means for Jesus to be the one who sustains us, spiritually and physically. How a baby in a feeding trough, born in the house of bread, continues to feed this world that is hungry for hope, peace, joy, and love. Amen.


