AUPC. I wanted to share some great new things coming, including some big changes, and ways you can be involved in the lives of our awesome children in our church family.

In early June, while our children celebrated another really fun year together learning about our faith in God, I was able to gather with some of our parents and caregivers upstairs in our "formerly" yellow, classroom/conference room to talk about the

future of our Sunday school classes. We have had two incredible teachers primarily running things over the last few years. They love our children. They work so hard to do the very best they can for them. But as we all know, it is hard to pour from an empty cup. Our teachers were almost never in worship with the rest of their church family. Sometimes it was a struggle to get volunteers for a number of reasons. Two adults are necessary for each classroom of children according to our safety policy, which meant a lot of shuffling week to week. And so we had some decisions to make together for the health of our teachers, our kids, and our caregivers. It was a meeting filled with great conversation, encouragement, and excitement about what we look to do next. Here is that in a nutshell:

- Sunday School for our children will now be 10:00am-10:45am, before our 11:00am worship service. This allows for us all to worship together as a church family and easier availability for our volunteers and teachers.
- 2. Sunday School classes for children will now operate on a rotation model. What does that mean? It means it will follow a model that works better for our church population. You sign up to teach or assist for only 3 weeks at a time! Sunday School goes from the week after Labor Day to the week before Memorial Day weekend. Here's how it will go:
 - a. Week 1- All children are together to hear and learn the Bible story for the rotation. (Two adults are needed for this one group; one can teach and one can

- assist, or both can teach. That's up to them!)
- b. Week 2- Children are split into two groups according to grades. Each group will attend Sunday school with two adults leading each class. Group A will learn about the Bible story heard during Week 1 from their teachers using one method, while Group B will learn about the Bible story heard during Week 1 from their teachers using another method. These methods can be: craft, music, art, cooking, stories, drama, video, games, etc. Teachers are encouraged to choose the one that fits their gifts. Lesson plans and supplies are provided too!
- c. Week 3 Group A and Group B will now switch to the other teacher/method from the week prior. They will again hear the story from Week 1.
- 3. The conference room will now become a lovely hangout spot from 10:00am-10:45am. If you're not volunteering in Sunday School that week, feel free to grab some coffee or tea via the Keurig, hang out in the space, read a book, chat with others, etc.

"Pastor Niki, this is great information. But I don't have any kids in the church, so I'm not really needed for teaching them." Wrong. (I bet you knew that was coming!) Here's merely a few reasons why our kids need

YOU (no matter your age, no matter your parent status.)

- 1. We just had a baptism in worship a couple of weeks ago. If you will recall, we are asked a vital question as members of a church family. "Do you, as members of the church of Jesus Christ, promise to continue to guide and nurture this child, by what you say and what you do, with love and prayer, encouraging them to know and follow Christ and to be a faithful part of their church family?" That is a question for ALL of us, no matter our age, if we have children or not, if our children are grown or not, if we have one child in our church or thirty. We are all called to guide and nurture those who come along our path.
- 2. Admittedly, we are not all gifted to teach children in a classroom, and that is okay. But you would be amazed to work with children in a setting like this. They are so eager to learn, to hear about God's love for them, how God has called different people to be a part of this world, and how they can live out God's commands to us, God's people.
- 3. Not only can our children learn from you, but YOU have plenty to learn from them! And no, not just how to operate a cell phone camera or what a "skibidi toilet" is (you don't want to know.) They're great at teaching us about God's great love for all creatures, the joy we find in Christ in their laughter, and lessons in humility when the "dad jokes" fall flat.

- Scripture is FILLED with passages telling us the importance of sharing our faith and stories with children. Read Proverbs 4, Deuteronomy 6, Exodus 12, Psalm 78, and Proverbs 22. And that's just a start.
- 5. When the grown ups in your life get you down, when the world feels oppressive with all the bad news, I have found that all of the children in our church family have their own beautiful ways to find joy around them. And they're more than happy to share those ways with us.

When I first encountered AUPC and looked at its Facebook page, I could not believe the number of children that were here. This is not a common thing. As a pastor, my first question was "what are they DOING?!" As a parent, it became clear quickly. I watched as our daughter latched onto one or two individuals who made her feel comfortable, safe, and loved. As those relationships grew, it made it easier for her to be who God has made her to be, in all of her wonder and silliness. She has been able to grow here as a child of God because of the children AND the adults who help to shape her. And as I sat in that meeting in early June, I heard other parents and caregivers say the same about their own kids. As your pastor (and yes, as a mom), I pray that you would go before God in prayer to see if and how God might be calling you to be a part of the children's ministry here at AUPC. I'd love to sit and chat with you about what it involves, what it could look like for you, and how our children can help you see God in the world.
