What does it mean to be grateful, to express your gratitude to another?

As we head into the actual fall season, this question comes to my mind ever more frequently. Leaves start turning orange and brown, pumpkins are everywhere, and I question almost daily if it's okay to put away my summer clothes and break out the leggings and cozy sweaters I crave so much. First, I'm grateful that I'm in the position to say I have enough clothing that I can switch things from season to season. And that I have the space in which to store those clothes. But how do I show that? To whom should I be saying "thanks for the blessing of drawers under my bed to store things?"
