#### Pastor Niki's Ponderings

This past Sunday, I started our mid-fall series entitled "Grateful Hearts, Open Hands." I'm excited about this series for a few reasons. The first is that I get to share the pulpit with other people in our church family. I've asked these individuals to come up and share their own story about how God calls them to be "managers of God's stuff", how they have seen God supply their needs in hard times, the tangible ways in which they have seen God use the giving of others to plant seeds of faith in next generations, and how naming Jesus as King of our lives means that we serve him by serving others. Hearing from those who sit in the pew with us can mean a great deal to people, including me as your pastor. We get to hear about the ways that the Spirit has moved in your life, which can be an encouragement for those listening (that's reason 2!)

There's another reason. You see, I find that it can be hard to be grateful at times. Sure, we thank God for our family, our friends, maybe our home. We have cute little prayers we say at the table for meals. But expressing our gratitude becomes more difficult when we don't see family as often as we'd like, or maybe we don't have much of a family at all, for all kinds of reasons. We feel lonely more than loved. Things in our home keep breaking, and it becomes a nuisance or real financial difficulty to keep up with all the breaking things. Our dollars don't stretch as much as they once did. We start to focus on what we don't have, what we wish we could do, who we wish was still sitting with us. I'll admit, it's been a hard year for me to focus on being grateful for who and what I have. And I know many of you are struggling too. It's hard to express thanks when things aren't going the way we want or need.

I came across a book earlier this year entitled "God's Gift of Generosity," by Karl B. Travis. And early in the book, I read this statement: "Finding cause for gratitude is redemptive because gratitude connects us to the source of all blessing, God. Gratitude...joins us to God's generous heart." (18-19.) I'm learning that expressing gratitude to God isn't JUST about giving thanks or being generous with things like money or time or my gifts or whatever for all that God does for me. All that we have is from God, true. God holds nothing back. But God isn't looking to settle some debt with us; generosity isn't meant to be a transaction between us and God. It's about being transformed by the very idea that God wants us to use all that and to change the world WITH us. Everything we give, everything we share, should lead us to know God more deeply and join WITH God in helping others do that too.

As you can probably gather, there's been a lot of praying and learning and reflection behind the scenes for this series. Each person I asked to share was chosen prayerfully and intentionally. The practices each week, the gratitude calendar in your newsletter and on our social media page, all of it has come out of a lot of heart work. And I pray that all we hear and learn in these next few weeks brings meaning to your hearts as well.
