

John August Swanson makes his home in Los Angeles, California, where he was born in 1938. His art reflects the strong heritage of storytelling he inherited from his Mexican mother and Swedish father. This colorful rendering of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem displays a large crowd all intently focused on him. They wave flags and palms as they follow Jesus in hope of changing circumstances. Among the crowd are also soldiers prepared to intervene should the crowd get too rowdy. Jesus sits peacefully atop a donkey, resigned to his future suffering and death. The sky is stormy, foreshadowing the coming Passion of Christ. This beautiful painting inspires in the viewer a similar hope for social justice, love, and peace.

Sunday, April 27, We Welcome to the Pulpit **Rev. Liddy Gerchman Barlow**.

The Rev. Liddy Barlow is a creative and passionate servant of the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic church in all its complicated diversity. She works to bring Christians of all traditions together to make visible our true unity as the Body of Christ.

In April 2014, Rev. Barlow became the first woman to be installed as Executive Minister of Christian Associates of Southwest Pennsylvania. She reports to the Council of Bishops and Judicatory Executives, who represent 28 Protestant, Catholic, and Orthodox church bodies throughout greater Pittsburgh. As Executive Minister, Rev. Barlow sets a vision for Christian Associates and manages all of the organization's projects and relationships.

Rev. Barlow is ordained in the United Church of Christ, and is a member of the national Manual on Church working group and the state-wide Keystone Working Group.

Rev. Barlow grew up in Keene, New Hampshire and attended Mount Holyoke College. After teaching sixth grade in Rocky Mount, North Carolina with the Teach for America program, she earned a Master of Divinity degree from Andover Newton Theological School. Prior to her ministry at Christian Associates, Rev. Barlow served congregations in downtown Pittsburgh and North Huntingdon. She lives in Pittsburgh with her husband Gregory, a robotics entrepreneur, and their two children.

AUPC FINANCIAL UPDATE—

I would like to keep you all apprised on the financial status at AUPC. Last Wednesday, the Session approved the following critical building maintenance updates: \$39,600 for the purchase of two new boilers for the Education Building, \$5,774 for ceiling replacements in two rooms in the sanctuary building, and \$3,200 for painting in those two rooms (later lowered to \$3,000). Because our Building Fund balance was approximately \$27,000, we voted to close two \$11,000 c.d.'s (at penalty) to come up with the difference. This leaves our Building Fund at a near \$0 balance. Another much-needed project for the near future is repairing the steps to the upper parking lot. The Building and Grounds Team is currently getting bids for that project.

PW voted on Sunday, March 23, to donate \$3,000 to the Building Fund, and our spaghetti dinner grossed \$1,371.25 towards that fund as well. Many thanks to those who organized and worked at the dinner, and to the very active women's organization for stepping up to the plate! We ARE blessed that we had savings to complete these projects. God is good!

I also have to let you know that we are showing a shortage each month with income vs. expenses. That shortage at the end of February was \$3,222.10, year-to-date. Of course, our utility bills are killing us during the winter months, and we should see some relief with the Spring weather.

We would like you to consider making a donation to our Building Fund to shore up that Fund, and to consider a small increase in your regular giving as you are able.


