Pastor Niki's Ponderings



As I write this, our family is on day 2 of "flexible instruction" with our daughter's school. The temperature is ridiculously low, and so many districts have called for flexible instruction so that people don't have to go out into the cold. Our daughter was in daycare during COVID lockdown, so we didn't have to zoom into classes each day, but this has absolutely made me appreciate teachers exponentially more than I did before (and believe me, I love teachers and aides and think they're incredible.) Here's what I've learned in these two days:

 No matter how many times you tell kids to go to the bathroom before starting class, you will inevitably

- have many of them still asking to go to the bathroom during class.
- 2. Teachers have endless patience for children asking all kinds of questions, including if they can use the bathroom. Again.
- 3. Kids ask a lot of questions.

If you're going to be a teacher, I think one of the gifts necessary is to have patience, and a lot of it. But these kids have gifts too. Some are good at drawing. Some ask really insightful questions. My daughter wanted to be helpful to the ones who were having trouble getting their worksheets done.

I have been taking a class to learn more about a church experience called "Messy Church." I know that some of you reading this may be familiar with it, but I was not. I was attracted to it because, for some people, sitting and listening in "typical church" is really hard. For some, it's not doable at all. In a conversation with another pastor about who we believe may be some of the outcasts, some of the modern day "widows and orphans" that aren't being reached by the church, we thought about that group of people. How can church be open and welcoming to those who struggle with "the way we've done things?"

I've preached recently on spiritual gifts, and how we can actually use our gifts to be the church in our community. Not just by being a "church officer," but by being God's hands and feet in your everyday life. Some practice the gift of patience by handling the questions of 18 children on Google Meet. Some use their gift of knitting to make scarves to give to local warming shelters. But as we will also talk about in this series (specifically on February 2), none of our gifts mean much without love, God's love for all people. Keep tuning in as we grow in these ways together.

\$\$ PER CAPITA \$\$

AUPC's 2025 per capita, as formulated by the Presbytery of Kiskiminetas, has been calculated at \$39.24 per member. This amount is then multiplied by the number of active members from the previous year. AUPC had 106 active members when the 2025 per capita was calculated, therefore being responsible for **\$4,159.44** to be paid before the end of 2025. We urge all members to pay their individual per capita during the months of January and February. The total amount collected during those 2 months is sent to Presbytery in a lump sum and the balance due is divided by the 10 months left in the year. This method of monthly payments eases any stress on the general budget that a large, one-time payment might cause. AUPC is responsible to pay for each member listed as active whether or not those members pay their share. Our goal is to keep our financial commitment just as we have done in the past. With your help, we will be able to meet that commitment and do it with a manageable monthly payment. Your per capita payment will be welcomed at any time throughout the year if you are unable to contribute during January or February. We thank all of our members for their continued support. financially, spiritually, and in-kind giving. AUPC is truly blessed.
