Every year, Presbyterians come together to celebrate **Heritage Sunday**, a day to reflect upon and learn more about the long and rich history of the Presbyterian Church. Presbyterian Heritage Sunday always falls on the Sunday closest to the 21st of May — the opening date of the inaugural General Assembly in the United States in 1789 in Philadelphia. At that time, the church had four synods, 16 presbyteries, 177 ministers, 419 congregations and an estimated membership of 18,000. Today, there are 16 synods, 166 presbyteries, nearly 18,000 ordained ministers (including retirees), and 1.1 million official members (roughly 2.5 million affiliated with the Presbyterian Church (USA).)
