#### Pastor Niki's Ponderings



"Aww man! Dang!" I shouted loudly from the shower one recent morning. Geoff hurriedly runs to the door. "What's the matter? Do you need something?" "Ugh, no. I just got Wham-med\*. I made it so far this year!"

In case this exchange makes zero sense to you, allow me to explain. Every December 1 begins the Wham! Game.
