As I write this, we are in the middle of the week before Memorial Day weekend, the "unofficial" start to the summer season. It's hot and sticky and sunny. I know summer has an official date on the calendar, but wow. I think we're there already.

I used to lament some of the summer season, particularly when I worked as a youth minister. Ministering to an affluent population, I had families who would stay at their lake cabins most of the summer, youth who went off to various camps, or just multiple vacations throughout the season with family and friends. It was a bummer to me because I would miss those families and our interactions.

As I've gotten older, I have realized that not only are there ways to stay connected (text messages, phone calls, fun cards, etc.), but I also more easily recognize the need for rest and connection amongst those we love. And sometimes, that happens more easily during a

time of relaxation, ease, even lackadaisicalness.

There are numerous times in scripture in which we see that rest is essential. Jesus often went off by himself to rest and to pray (Mark 1, Luke 5, Matthew 14, for examples). When the prophet Elijah was on the run for his life and depressed, the Lord God reminded him to have a snack, drink some water, and take a nap (1 Kings 19). We often forget that taking time to rest is one of the ten commandments given by God to the people of Israel (Exodus 20.) I would encourage you to even read about rest and the celebration of Jubilee in the book of Leviticus. Rest is paramount to our mental and physical health, as well as our spiritual health.

However, connection remains important too. And so when we take our times away during the summer to rest, how are we continuing to remain connected to one another, as well as to our Triune God? Phone calls and texts and visits and cards are great. But let's try a fun practice too, shall we?

During worship on Sunday, June 2nd (our next communion Sunday), each family will receive a small Jesus figure. Imagine him to be a representative of our church family, if you will. During your summer travels, activities, or lazing abouts, you are encouraged to take a photo of your "Jesus-With-Me" and sendan email to the church office or text it to Pastor Niki to be shared on our social media pages throughout the summer. We'll also keep track on one of our church bulletin boards to see all of the great places that you bring Mini Jesus to this summer. Allow your Mini Jesus to be your reminder that your church family is praying for you, and that the Holy Spirit is always with you. Let's have fun and a wonderful summer season, no matter when it starts and ends for you.
