Invitation to the Lord's Table, Great Thanksgiving, and the Lord's Prayer (congregational response in bold)

Friends, why have you come?
To taste and see that the Lord is good.
Whom do you seek?
Our Lord, Jesus Christ, our host and guest.
Who may gather at this table?
The Lord invites everyone; no one is turned away.

The Lord be with you. And also with you. Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

On this holy night, gathered around your table, we remember how you have fed us.

In Eden's garden...we could not have. God's people ate, and it was the first sin.

In the desert...and water from a rock. God's people ate, and our strength was renewed.

In the kingdom...set out food without cost. God's people ate, and relearned how to share.

In a stable in Bethlehem...and be called the bread of life. God ate with us. God shared our life.

On a mountain by the sea...an answer to our prayer. God's people pray still: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, for thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.

Holy Spirit...your forgiveness and love. As God's people eat, transform our hearts.

In an upper room in Jerusalem...sealed in his own blood. God's people ate, and their sin was lifted from them. 
