
THE LISTENING POST

I enjoy musicals. My spouse and I often joke that the world might be a little brighter if we just broke into random song every now and then, kind of like a musical. Although "Les Miserables" is a musical and not exactly bright and cheerful...but there's hope in it, and that's what matters. Anyway, one of the musicals I have always enjoyed is "RENT." We had tickets to see it live in Pittsburgh on April 1, 2018, but then I had a baby 3 months early, so I gave the tickets to someone who would be able to go and appreciate it.

If you've never seen it, "RENT" is loosely based on an opera called "La Boheme" from the late 19th century. It was written by Jonathan Larson and takes place in NYC in the early 1980s, focusing on a group of artist friends and acquaintances trying to make a life for themselves in the midst of also dealing with poverty and the burgeoning HIV/AIDS crisis. The opening song, "Seasons of Love," gives a preview of what you are about to witness in the performance:

Five hundred twenty-five thousand, six hundred minutes Five hundred twenty-five thousand moments so dear Five hundred twenty-five thousand, six hundred minutes How do you measure, measure a year... ...How about love?

This song has been rolling around in my head lately (along with the new Taylor Swift album, obviously.) How does one measure a year? Love seems a perfect way to do so.

I've been preaching through the letter of First John as we've moved in this Eastertide and approaching Pentecost, and the letter is all about love. With beautiful reminders to the followers of Jesus Christ that "perfect love casts out fear (1 John 4:18)", "we love because God loved us first (4:19)", "if anyone obeys God's word, love for God is made completely in them (2:5)," to name a few, it is clear to us that love is at the forefront of God's mind, and should therefore be at the forefront of our own. But how does one measure a year in terms of love? And should we keep score at all?

No, I don't believe we should keep score. Goodness knows that if God kept score, we'd all be in negative digits at this point with no hope to move onward and upward. But God doesn't keep score. God doesn't give us love in equal measure to what we put out. God gives us love abundantly and beyond our wildest dreams. But if we consider the ways in which we have seen love, shown love, been recipients of love, have individuals that we love, I'm sure our lists would include things like the following: making or delivering a meal to a friend in need, running carpool for a week for your neighbors, attending a hard doctor visit with someone, sending a card of appreciation, welcoming your new pastor and her family as if they've always been a part of you, including all who attend an event or party to the best of your ability, a hug, a comforting hand on the shoulder, meeting with someone to discuss and resolve disagreements, sharing a good book or movie, and the list goes on and on.

If I were to measure what has been one year since first meeting the individuals who served on the PNC of AUPC and BSPC, I would certainly measure that year in love. All 525,600 minutes.




