Pastor Niki's Ponderings

I've thought a lot about power recently. As a light-skinned individual (ghost-like in the winter months, honestly), there is definitely a certain amount of privilege that I carry in our country. But I'm also a woman, and women have been described in all kinds of ways that lend to being seen as "less powerful" or having less privilege in a male-dominated society. I'm also in a male dominated profession, with many women having come before me to lobby for and fight for the ability to stand in a pulpit and preach the gospel, even though it was women who preached the gospel first (they found the empty tomb, remember?) We're used to believing that power is meaningful for getting things

done, and if you want things done, you've got to have connections with powerful people to get them done.

God is powerful. We read in scripture that God shows up in pillars of smoke and fire. God parts entire bodies of water for others to pass through without getting wet. God rains fire from heaven to light up a soaking wet altar of wood. God is so powerful that mountains are said to crumble if God wills it. God created something from nothing. God can get it done because God has got the power.

So why in the world did our all-powerful God show up as a fleshy, vulnerable, dependent baby named Jesus? Is it because babies dictate the schedules and sleep of their caregivers, and in that way wield all the power? Did God want to be an all-powerful baby? Of course not.

Jesus had all the power of God. Jesus healed people who couldn't see or walk. Jesus cured sickness and death. Jesus turned water into wine (good wine, at that.) Jesus could multiply food for those who were hungry. Jesus could have snapped his fingers and rid the earth of those who didn't agree with him when he told them what the kingdom of God was really like.

He didn't. Nearly every story we read about the interaction of Jesus with others in the gospels shows us an inversion of the world's understanding of power. Jesus flipped tables in the temple courts, he spent time with sinners and lepers. He even told people they should go last, not first, and that love was the best way.

Jesus had power, but used it in a different way than what we've come to be told by the world is the right way. I'm not saying Jesus was Spiderman, but he knew that with great power, came great responsibility. His Abba in heaven had entrusted it to him and rather than be tempted to use it for fame, fortune, and royal rule (as Satan approached him in the wilderness), he showed the world a better way.

During Lent, we'll step away from the lectionary to explore some of the ways in which Jesus "turned over tables," ending finally with the biggest table-turn of all, defeating death on Resurrection Sunday. If you're interested, I'd encourage you to work through the devotional, "Turning Over Tables" by Kathy Escobar. Some of our series will be based on what's shared in her devotional, as well as the scriptures for each week.

I look forward to journeying through Lent with you, learning how to flip some tables together.
